FIELDNOTES OF A SEARCH FOR ORIGINAL CORNERS

from NE corner of survey #15, Cert, #4277, to SW cornerof survey #9, Cert, #4274, all in Block "D", G.C. & S.F.Ry.Co., Val Verde County, with a view to establishing definitely the boundary line between Surveys #10 and #11, same Block,

Beginning at a Rock Mound near ravine from which a Cedar 8' dia, marked "X" bears N 71° E 7 varas identified as the original NE corner of survey #15 and NW corner of survey #14, Cert. #4277, Block "D", G.C. & S.F.Ry. Co., Val Verde County. Tehos,

Thence South-

At 640 varas cross ravine.

At 1900 varas an old stone mound on top of hill, the SE corner of said

survey #15.

At 3800 varas a stone mound in Devil's River flat above field, from which point the East edge of a lagoon or low strip of valley bears S 30° W 140 varas. No bearing trees could be identified, but numbers of large mesquite stumps, some of which were cut and others burnt were found within a radius of 50 varas of where the bearing trees should be. At a point 328 varas West and 97 varas South from this point in lagoon there are no mesquits growing nor can there be found any evidence that any ever had grown within a radius of 200 varas or more larger than two and a half or possibly three inches in diameter,

At 4200 varas in field,

At 5000 varas bed of Devil's River about 200 varas West. At 5700 varas a point in valley East of Devil's River.

Thence West 328 varas.

Thence South-

At 97 varas a point from which a stone mound bears S45W about 10 varas. This point is \$350 110 varas East of the channel of Devil's River and is on ground at least 15 feet higher in elevation than the channel, The stone mound is supposed to be the one J.H.Brauer mentioned as being built by Mr. Pierce.

At 2209 varas a point in the East edge of the channel of Devil's River.
No Sycamores N50E 50 varas.
At 2709 varas a point in the channel of Devil's River nearer the West

edge. Thence S 42° W 120 varas a point in the middle of the old San Antonic road. This old road, being just below the one now traveled from Juno to Comstock, is evidently the one called for in the original fieldnotes for there is no other old road nor crossing in this immediate vicinity.

Thence North-At 500 varas a point on the West bank of Devil's River from which the course and distance of N50E 50 varas lands in a mot of sycamore trees in the w edge of the channel. No marked trees can be found, but there are signs of older trees, such as dead stumps, exposed rotted roots, etc. This mot of sycamores extends North for about 100 varas and the line would still remain on bank for 100 varas further North, but for any point further South no sign of sycamore trees could be found for bearings.

At 3480 varas land in bed of Devil's River for the first and only time

on this run North,
