description of the corners of sur N^o 1 Cert #569
C6 S 1/4 R 5 T 6 R Co - which are connected by me
to the S W cor of sur N^o 160 - S 1/4 T 6 R Co at Bear
Lake. Are as follows. Began at the m^c on West
bank of small dry creek - supposed to be about
200 m^c South of Shafter trail - A small cedar
bush about 2 1/2 in dia - marked w^m N 54 W. 400 m^c
thence ran East over fine rolling country 1804
m^c to a rock m^c about 2 ft high. The center rock
in said m^c - being a sharp smooth rock
set upon end - 1 ft being cut in same - from
this rock m^c a cedar bush marked \equiv to S 25 W
300 m^c. Shafter trail estimated to be about
300 m^c to the Northward. A line run East from
this rock m^c would cross Shafter trail in 400
or 500 m^c. A line run South would cross a ravine
between 300 or 400 m^c below its head. This rock
m^c is situated on top of first hill that you
rise coming up the canon that Shafter
trail follow. And is clearly identified as the
SE cor of sur N^o 1 - from field note furnished
by Mr Cassin. Who established said corner
in 1881.
