

Field notes of a connecting line
on the S W cor of survey No 160
at Beaver Lake. to the N E cor of
survey No 1 Blk W B. Cert No 569
C Co W & R S N S Ry Co. And from
said cor to the S E cor of survey
No 14 B & S N Ry Co at Pecan Springs
on Dent's river. Beginning at a ^{point}
the S W cor of sur No 160. upon which
Beaver Lake is situated.

Thence North 90 we point

" N 15° W 364 we Rk mch on
West bank of Dent's river. this being
trial corner for survey No 160. made by
E A Giraud.

Thence West 94 ⁸/₂ we point

" South 69 we to a large Rk mch
3 ft high on top of mountain. on which
a cedar 5 in dia. brs N 49° W 69 we
this being the cor of Mason Co School
Land.

Thence West 11000 we to a point called
point A.

Then went to N E cor of sur No 1
Cert No 569. a Rk mch on South side
of Shafter's trail from Camp Hudson to
Pecan this Rk mch being marked on Cap
No 1 & 1. And identified by bearings &

thus making it evident from above
connection that the N E cor of sur
No 1 is 10045 rods South and 20516 rods
West of S W cor of sur No 160 surveyed
in the month of November 1875

This connection was run to complete
a circuit from since N E cor No 1
to the S W cor of sur No 160 by way
of Pecan Springs and up the bushy
valley of White River.

 on Devils River - And failing to find a point
 on the ground between said corner and
 this - This connection makes it evident
 that the N.E. cor of sur No 1 - is 5 + 29 vrs
 North and 8365 vrs West of the true
 corner of sur No 14 - So shown on sketch
 here to attached - The field notes of No 1
 would place it - 7200 vrs North - and
 8400 vrs West - And on the sketch that
 of the country West of Devils River the
 field notes of sur No 1 - were assumed
 to be correct as to course and distance
 and sketch compiled accordingly
 from field notes furnished by Mr Cassin
 Surveyed in the month of April 1855 -
 Saw Locke and Oliver Pierce Chainmen
 Bob Wallam Flagman. Var 9 - 45° East

Do hereby certify that the bearings and
description of the corners of sur N-1-Cert #569
C B S D + R S T & R Co - which were connected by run
to the S W cor of sur N-160 - S + S T R Co at Beaver
Lake. Are as follows. Began at the mca on West
bank of small Cry Creek - supposed to be about
200 or South of Shafter trail - A small cedar
bush about 2 1/2 in dia - marked + br N 54 N. 40 W
Thence run East over fine rolling country 1204
or to a rock mca about 2 ft high the center rock
in saice mound - being a sharp smooth rock
set upon end - (H+I) being cut in same - from
this rock mca a cedar bush marked = br S 25 W
30 W. Shafter trail estimated to be about
300 or to the Northward - A line run East from
this rock mca would cross Shafter trail in 400
or 500 or. A line run South would cross a ravine
between 300 or 400 or - below its head - This rock
mca is situated on top of first hill - that you
rise coming up the Canon that Shafter
trail follow - and is clearly identified at the
N E cor of sur N-1 - from field note furnished
by Wm Cassin. W's establish saice corner
in H+I -
