Dear Sir;

I am sending you herewith field notes for Surveys No. 1036 S. Pt., No. 1037, No. 22 and 60 together with a Sketch "Val Verde County Blk. E.G. G.C.&.S.F. Ry. Co!" and Sketch "Continental Ranch, Val Verde County!" The latter Sketch showing connection lines by which the lands covered by above field notes were located on the ground.

There are very few original mounds to be found in this vicinity and the sketch with connection lines indicated in red shows how I went about locating this land, from established and recognized corners. The only difficulty with this work is the lack of any recognized land marks to establish the N. line of Surveys No. 22, No. 23 and 60, however there is a property line fence at this point so near the Survey line that it would indicate that at the time the fence was built something must have been known as to the proper location of Survey lines. There is nothing to indicate on the ground that there is either an excess or shortage in the three Surveys mentioned, thuss I gave them the usual 1900 vrs.

There are very few original monuments to be found in this vicinity and  
the sketch with connection lines indicated in red shows how I went about  
connecting the lands, from established and recognized corners. The only  
disturbance with this work is the lack of any recognized land marks to  
establish the N. line of Surveys No. 55, No. 52 and 60, however, there is  
a properly fine fence at this point so near the survey line that it would  
indicate just at the time the fence was built something must have been  
known as to the proper location of Survey lines. There is nothing to  
indicate on the ground that there is either an excess or shortage in the  
three surveys mentioned, hence I gave them the usual 1000 Acs.
