 is very imperfect it will give you an idea how the  
 Surveys lie there is a conflict on the Daniel Smith  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  Sq and on the John Blair Sq of 800 m and the  
 conflict continues north to the Hunt County Line  
 the S.E. corner of the Walker and the S.W. corner of the  
 Parkman are only 1100 var apart on the ground

and the J. W. Pitman and Lucy Pavy are in conflict  
with the Willis and Alice Tutin in running N. 15. W. and the  
Alice Tutin and J. McNeill come on the J. Smith's  
by 500 in when you show up the Survey as it  
is they are on the Ground with the County Maps  
that will close the W. W. Scott's Survey up to the  
J. Hamilton's No 17 right where it is on the  
Ground and when you show the 4<sup>th</sup> row of  
Sections W. of the Blair and J. Smith up 500  
var. 50 on the J. Smith and Blair with where  
they are on the Ground that will close the  
J. E. Murray Survey up to the W. corner of the  
James Hamilton's Section No 17 with where  
it lies on the Ground. The David Clapp Survey  
is situated further East than it appears to be on  
the ground from the fact that the Hamilton  
Survey and the Priest and Harris and several  
others all made by Surveyor Simpson are all very  
large so large that it has shewed them further  
W. W. than the field notes have placed them  
all that I ask is for the chief Draftsman  
to give my Sketch a thorough Examination  
and by the assistance of all the documents  
in the office I think that he will be able  
to close the County map in that Section

## Water Courses

on Prof Bremmes Map A.D. 1870 the Headwaters of Saline creek are brought over the High lands of the R Towns L + C Survey into Mill creek at Canton the County Town and Mill creek below Canton is carried over the High lands of the J. D. Lyne + E. Caney <sup>L + C</sup> Survey into Saline creek - the Headwaters of the River are made to run north through the R Towns <sup>1/3</sup> Lea instead of south as they should. And the Saline River is made to run through the J. D. Rains Survey thus leaving part of said Survey in Rains County when in fact the J. D. Rains Survey is wholly south of the river and almost entirely in Vanzandt County + on the Hunt County line and the N.E. Cor of the J. D. Rains is 100 varas west from the River.

Mill creek rises in the L + C Survey of the R Towns and runs north through the Rains Survey of the J. D. Rains and continues through the Rains Survey of the J. D. Lyne, E. Vanzickle and continuing on northward receiving numerous tributaries disemboques itself into the Saline River. - Caney creek does not head in the J. D. Lyne L + C Survey but north of the A. Duches 1280 Survey and these small streams run into Mill - a small branch heading at the E. Corner of the A. Duches flows through the J. C. Anderson into Saline creek. - Saline creek rises in the J. R. Small <sup>1/3</sup> Lea Survey as shown by Stremans and flowing through

the J. Fortune - Bridges - Del Toro - and MR Powell 1/3  
League Surveys, and through the E Cor of the R. Downs  
L & L Survey into & through the E Carew Survey and  
on ~~as~~ shown by Stremme to the Sabine River  
The Streams in the North West part of the County  
do not flow South through the J Welch L & L Sur  
into Carey Creek as Prof Stremme shows but S.W.

is flowing in some of the ~~in~~ <sup>in</sup> ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> ~~map~~ <sup>map</sup>  
mistake of Prof Stremme's map.

Continuing the notes on the margin of the plot and taking  
the South West Corner of the Dan Smith 1/3 League Survey as the  
initial point which point was the original East Corner of a  
Large Block of League and Labor Surveys known as King's  
Block the Eastern Block <sup>Susany Latham</sup> of which was never patented but was  
cut up into smaller surveys and here about this corner the  
Survey's pile upon each other in glorious confusion the conflicts  
being as follows East - West 731 <sup>varas</sup> and North 45° East 383 <sup>varas</sup>  
of the R. Gonzales L & L Survey the distance 4971 <sup>varas</sup> as is  
E Cor to Gonzales due south to the N B line of the J. Welch L & L Sur  
the distance is 6910. The South B line of the L. Pruett L & L Sur  
is 700 <sup>varas</sup> long or 5800 <sup>varas</sup> which sets off the E & B lines of  
the Pruett & Welch Survey at an angle of 8°. Now going to  
the East Corner of the E. Cook 1250 acre Survey on the old Cherokee line  
and running South 45° West we reach the East Corner of J. Hamilton 17  
<sup>at</sup> 8 <sup>varas</sup> and from the North Corner of the T. J. Shaw L & L Survey  
South 45° West at 5400 <sup>varas</sup> we reach the North Corner of same corner  
S 45° W at 8350 <sup>varas</sup> we reach the North Corner of the D. Clapp <sup>at</sup>  
at 8800 <sup>varas</sup> the South Corner of J. Hamilton N: 14 and at 9220 <sup>varas</sup> the East  
Corner of the A. Arnold. The N. E. B. line of J. Hamilton N: 11 is 2240 <sup>varas</sup>  
long & the N. Corner of same is on the S. B. line of the J. Blair Sur. The S. W.  
Cor of the D. Clapp and N. W. Cor. of the B. Brewton instead of being at  
the same point the Brewton is 290 <sup>varas</sup> east of the Clapp the Brewton  
being short East & West about 300 <sup>varas</sup>. If the Draftsman will keep  
these facts in view I think he will have no trouble in closing up these  
surveys
