FIELD NOTES of a survey of Six hundred and forty acres of Land, made for the State of Texas, it being the quantity of land to which it is entitled by virtue of Alternate Land Scrip No. 1603 issued to Beaty, E. T. Seale and J. M. Forwood.

Said Survey is No. 876 in Webb County, situated on the waters of the

Santa Isabel Creek a tributary of the Rio Grande River, about ~~forty two~~^{35½} miles N ~~22~~¹⁵ W of the City of Laredo.

beginning at a post being the North corner of a survey No. 875 made for Nicolas Sanchez by virtue of said Alternate Land Scrip No. 1603, issued to Beaty, Seale and Forwood on the 12 April 1875.

Thence N. 44° E. at 550 varas post and stone in prairie for the East corner & beginning corner.

Thence N. 46° W. 1900 varas to post and stone for the North corner.

Thence S. 44° W. at 1050 varas the Santa Isabel creek at 1900 varas post for West corner.

Thence S. 46° E. 1900 varas post and stone for the South corner on the N.W. boundary of survey for Nicolas Sanchez from which a mezquite X bears N 28° E 21 varas and mezquite mkd \equiv bears S. 46° W. 12 varas.

Thence N 44° E with said Sanchez survey 1900 varas to the place of beginning.

situated on the waters of Santa Isabel Creek, a tributary of the
Rio Grande River, about $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles N. $15^{\circ} W$ of the City of Laredo
beginning at a post, bearing N. $19^{\circ} 23' W$ 11284 from the South East
corner of survey No. 1047 made for Juan Ramos by virtue of Scrip
No. 502 issued to Beaty, Seale and Forwood January 9th 1875 for the
East corner from which a Mesquite marked \ominus bears N $46^{\circ} W$ 21 varas.
Thence North $46^{\circ} W$ at 1900 varas set a post for North corner from
which a Mesquite marked $+$ bears N $36^{\circ} E$ 53 varas. Thence S $44^{\circ} W$
at 460 the Arroyo Santa Isabel at 1826 varas the road to Eagle
Pass runs N. N. W. at 1900 varas set post for the West corner from
which a Mesquite marked $/ \ \ \backslash$ bears S $51^{\circ} W$ 36 varas Thence S $46^{\circ} E$
1900 varas to post and stone for the South corner from which a
Mesquite marked $+$ bears N $63^{\circ} E$ 145 varas. Thence N $44^{\circ} E$ at 835
varas the Eagle Pass Road at 950 varas Santa Isabel Creek at 1900
varas the place of beginning.
