 County, under the official oath of my office, that I
 did on the 21st & 23^d of June 1876. Begin at
 the N.W. corner of the Wm. Robinson Survey west
 of Colorado river in Wharton County, having previously
 set said corner by accurate measure from the
 S.E. corner of the Wm. S. Evans on the Colorado River,
 that I ran with field notes on hand S. 25°
 E. 6000 ft. to the Southeast corner of the William
 Robinson, put down a stake & spaled 4 large
 holes thence dist to stake & making a mound, thence
 I ran N 65° E. 1000.00 to the corner of the McHarlane
 as per field notes & established a corner as before
 thence I ran S. 25° E. 4000 along west line of
 McHarlane, to his S.W. corner, established as the
 others, thence N 87° E. 4360.00 to the Colorado River
 Bank, where I established the East corner of the
 J. McHarlane, laid a stake on Bank of River with
 3 cotton wood bearing trees. & I further certify that
 I am firmly of the belief that that this line never
 was run but only called for the same length as
 the Kincaid, 3500. I began at the Kincaid corner
 on the River, ran out 3500.00 as per field notes, measured
 across to the McHarlane, at 90°. & found the vacancy to
 be 1006.00 wide. Measured up to the McHarlane corner

and found it to be 161405. Ran from the
 Knicheloe S W Corner S. 70° E. 8100.05. found the
 line of the Key Kendall, where intersected by this
 line, & the Corner put down by some one else to be
 253 75. Knowing I had gain the Knicheloe
 land all it was entitled to. I concluded the 253
 75 to be an own measure of some Drunken
 Surveyor. & therefore adopt ^{my measure} making the corner
 of the Henry Griffith 253 75 further out & making
 the whole large Survey to consist, with a difference
 of northings & Southings of 16705 E & W. 1100, I
 make the vacant land between Knicheloe &
 McFarlane because the Field notes say begin the
 McFarlane Survey ^(at the Robinson corner) on the River & run S 65 W 50000
 along the S.E. line of the Robinson, &c. The Robinson
 line was good, leaving 100000 difference. The McFarlane
 does not call for the Knicheloe.

I also certify that the connections as
 shown on the map between the John S. Evans Survey & the
 Survey was accurately measured twice, with much
 care & the conflict, carefully measured, actually, no guess
 work

The original file with out

 Survey showing and the river
 is not sufficient. The corner
 of each leg will have to
 be found, as it is very likely
 that the surveys are really
 wider than called for. For
 instance, Section 3, West. Co. is found
 to be 66 18 on, though the title
 calls only for 6000 on.
