## To the Commissioner of the General Land office, Austin, Texas,

Additional statement as to a resurvey of the original surveys on Sandy Creek in Wharton County.

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The lower Dunlap, Jackson and Wharton Counties, and the Lower Wickham. The first was located in 1330, and the latter in 1333. The Wickham calls to begin at the N. E. Corner of the Dunlap, located /3 monthelater. by this it is evident that the survey was made in 1333 as stated and the field notes of the Wickham returned to the Land Office while the Dunlap field notes were not returned until 1330, Although the survey was made in 1333. The same condition exists with the Bolton, the two upper Dunlaps and the upper Wickham.

The three first named surveys were located in 1345 and the Upper Wickham in 1344. It is evident that this survey was made by beginning at the N. E. corner of the Bolton, thence down the creek or East line of the timber and was surveyed in 1344, and the field notes of the Wickham returned to the land office, and the Bolton and the Two Dunlaps were not returned until 1345.

To locate the upper Wickham by tying to the Bolton and Dumlaps, the call for the N. E. corner of the Wickham on the East side of the Creek, and the call for the creek timber at 970 varas, and the call for a corner in a wet brushy prairie, are accommodated; but to begin at the N. W. corner of the lower Wickham and reverse the calls, no other call can be found. To place the N. E. Corner of the Upper Wickham on the East side of Sandy as called for, thence South 1900 vrs. will place the S. E. Corner of this survey. 500 or 600 varas East of the North East corner of the lower Wickham. It is apparent that these surveys were not connected as called for. It is impossible to even extend the Wickham to meet the calls of the lower Wickham, hence the only method by which these surveys can be located and accommodate the calls is as shown in sketch filed by Mr. Lapkey.

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To re-locate these surveys by tying to the lower Wickham would put the N. E. corner of each survey on the Eest side of Sandy. It is clear that from the calls in the field notes that the Surveyor in the original survey, followed the timber line on the East side of Sandy.

The calls in the upper Wickham conflict, and the one or the other must be abandoned.

The beginning call is a stake in a wet brushy prairie and will practically fit the call for an island of timber at 700 varas and creek timber at 900 varas, and place the corner on the East side of the creek. To tie to the Lower Wickham and run North 1900, East 1900 would not reach the creek timber by about 600 varas nor would it reach the creek by about 900 varas.
