The NW Corner of the 1000 Acs is established by distance to west mistletoe creek and its bearing lines -

The course to the Iron State the recognized SW Corner of the said 1000 Acs League is South instead of S 00 30' E. -

Section 44 begins at 220 rods from S.W. corner of the League -

Thence N with west line of same the call distance 1453 rods - Thence west to intersect the East line of 43. W.C.R.R. Co -

Referring to Section 51 W.C.R.R. - NW corner a Railroad Iron & bearing lines found - & identified. Thence East 1901 N.E. corner of 57 Iron State center of road -

Referring to SW corner 43 W.C.R.R. the corner established & recognized from bearing line found - Thence E (Call 1901) actual to make bearing on head timber of creek or branch fit - 1970.00 -
