

From notes of a connecting line run to es-  
 tablish the variation of Blocks No. 13, 14, 15-  
 + 16 made for the Houston and Texas  
 Central R. R. Co. in Wilbarger County  
 Texas, Beginning at a cotton wood on the  
 south bank of Red River N. 66 E. 320  
 rs. from the N.E. corner of Survey No. 1.  
 Blk. No. 11. H. & T. C. R. R. Co. which tree  
 is called for in the field notes for said  
 survey, Thence S. 66 W. 1270 rs. a stake  
 at the exact mouth of Wanderer's creek  
 it being the N. W. corner of <sup>said</sup> Survey No. 1.  
 Thence running at a variation of 9.15 E.  
 S. 18 E. 26560 rs. to a point on the north  
 bank of Pease River just above the mouth  
 of Buffalo creek, thence S. 72 W. 1394 rs.  
 Thence N. 18 W. 172 rs. to a stake the S. E.  
 corner of sec. No. 1. Blk. No. 16. H. & T.  
 C. R. R. Co. from which a cotton wood  
 tree ~~is~~ marked = Drs N. 70 E. 175 rs.  
 another cott. tree = N. 51 1/2 E. 200 rs.  
 said corner is N. 18 W. 40 rs. from the  
 north bank of Buffalo creek. I had  
 corrected the Va. to 6.20 E. I commenced  
 at the S.E. corner of Sec. No. 1. Blk 16 and  
 running S. 18 E. at 180 rs. the north bank  
 of Pease River - at 840 rs south bank  
 of Pease River continuing same course at  
 counter 40185

15200 vrs to a stake the N.E. cor. 110 and NW corner of 98 BLK 14. Thence S  $27^{\circ}$  W 2687 vrs to NW corner of Sec No 109 in the W.B. line 115. BLK 14. same sur. Thence S  $18^{\circ}$  E 1900 vrs to the common corner of surveys 40103, 104, 109 & 115 in a pool of water in Ferris or Pool creek from which a double Cotton wood plainly marked but now blown down brs. S.  $56^{\circ}$  W 15 vrs. and another double cotton wood marked brs. S.  $17^{\circ}$  E. 14 vrs. Thence S.  $63^{\circ}$  E. 2687 vrs to a stake in prairie the S.E. cor of 103 & N.E. cor No 102 same blk and sur. From which a mesquite stump about five feet high plainly marked  $\begin{matrix} \equiv \\ \times \\ \equiv \end{matrix}$  brs N  $81^{\circ}$  W. 147 vrs. Thence N.  $72^{\circ}$  E. at 20900 vrs a pile of stone at the foot of a hill the N.E. cor No 20 and S.E. cor. No 19 BLK. 14 at 22800 vrs a stone mound from which a cotton wood marked  $\begin{matrix} \equiv \\ \times \\ \equiv \end{matrix}$  brs N.  $31\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E 54 vrs. same being the N.E. cor. No 11 and S.E. cor of No 12. at 26600 vrs the N.E. cor. of sur No 1 BLK 14.

I then commenced at the S.E. corner of BLK. 13 H. & T. C. R.R. Co an earthen mound covered with sand stone rock from the creek from which a two pronged red elm under the north bank of the creek marked  $\begin{matrix} \equiv \\ M \\ \equiv \end{matrix}$  brs S.  $33\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E. 49 vrs a cluster red elm at the head of barve brs N.  $56\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  W about 900 vrs two cotton wood trees now blown down but still lying on the bank of

the creek br. N. 86<sup>o</sup> W. the stumps of two  
cotton wood trees br. S. 33<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> W 39<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> W. —  
Thence I ran N. 18 W. crossing creek repeatedly,  
at 9800 cross creek found cotton wood tree  
with an old side line mark, at 1900 W. found  
pile of rock called for from which the stumps  
of the two hickys called for br. S. 35 W 25 W.  
at 7600 W found a large pile of stone, continuing,  
at 11400 W the N.E. cor of sec. No 33 thence  
S. 72. W 1900 W to the N.W. corner No 33. thence  
N. 81<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> W. 467 W to the N.E. cor. No 1 Blk 14.  
I thence went back and commenced at the N.E.  
corner No 33 Blk No 13. thence N. 72 E. 1900 W.  
a mound and four pits the N.W. cor. of No 31  
at 3800 W a mound and four pits the N.E.  
cor of No 31, thence N. 27 E. 2687 W. the  
N.E. cor. No 37 thence S. 71<sup>o</sup> 20' E. 1950 W. S. 67<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>  
E. 3080 W. thence N 84 E. 244 W to the 17<sup>th</sup>.  
mile stone of the line between Walbarger & Wichelaf  
I then went back to the N.E. cor of sec. No 37  
Blk 13. and ran N. 18 W. 5700 W. to N.E. cor.  
sec. 53 Blk. 13 a mound and four pits,  
thence N. 18 W. 1000 W. thence N. 64<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> W.  
1894 W. thence N. 38<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> W 540 W to the S.E.  
corner of the Arund. W. Gates survey

Field notes of a connecting line between Blocks  
5 and 13 T. and S. Co. R. R. Co.

Beginning at a stake on the West side of  
Beaver Creek, where I found an elm marker  
= being the same identified by the District  
Surveyor of the Clay to now district from the  
S. W. corner of No 14 Blk. 5 accepted as  
the best defined corner in said Blk. thence  
N 72 E. crossing Beaver Creek three times at  
1900 vs a stake the N. E. corner as established  
by said district surveyor, then N 72 E. 19000 vs.  
to a pile of stone the N. E. corner of No 10 on  
the S. E. bank of Sunflower Creek 140 vs  
N 72 E. from creek. The natural calls for all  
these corners fit well. I then commenced at  
the N. E. corner No 3 and ran N 18 W. at  
4740 vs crossed camp creek at 5007 vs  
recrossed camp creek at 5700 vs the N. E.  
corner of Section No 6. Blk 5. Thence S. 39 1/4 E.  
500 vs. to the S. E. corner of sec. No 1 Blk. No  
13. - Va. 9 15 E.
