In reply to the complain of S. C. Inman and W. D. Inman, J. Fredrick Loeschman, who has become the owner of the Title granted by S. Damon to Morgan L. Smith, and which was transferred to me by Leg. Whitefort in 1881. do hereby state, that I do not dispute the Title of Thomas H. Dillard's Survey, because all Titles up to the transfere of Mrs. A. M. Williams showing the ancient Landmarks, of the Westhalfe of the Damon League. There is no question about a division line. The main question is which Title of S. Damon shall form the Division line, Title No 1, or Title No 2.

Subdivision No 4. a Title of 316 1/2 acres which was transferred to Mrs A. M. Williams will prove the original corners, she also refers here Sales to the Dover line, without calling for the original Bearings. This Bearing trees have been purposely destroyed in 1869, with the intention to move the Dover and

^{W.S.} Parker corner. If said Plaintiff will prove the fact, he will find that he made new Bearings in 1889 and then claims that this was done 40 years ago. we request the Court to order a survey by Court, and we will be able to prove that said Inman trespassed the original Boundaries of The Thomas H. Dillard survey, and made the new line for which he entered the suit, and claims that we try to trespass. the ancient Land marks of our Title as described in the Deed given by S. Damon to M. L. Smith see Deed records Vol. 1. pages 205-206-207. I only claim the Land to which I am intitled by Law. J. Loeschman.

 by Thomas H. Dillard of Brazoria County and State of Texas, the receipt whereof
 is hereby acknowledged, have bargained, sold, and conveyed, and by these presents do
 bargain sell and convey unto said Thomas H. Dillard a certain tract or parcel
 of land situated in the County of Milam and State of Texas and on a creek known
 as Brushy, containing one half of League of Land or two thousand two hundred
 and fourteen English acres in the following Survey No 1. Beginning at the south East
 corner of League I at a Post from which an Elm tree 10" dia: bears North 40 East 35 vrs. and
 Cedar tree 4" dia: bears South 82 West 34 vrs. Thence N. 71 E. two thousand five hundred
 varas to the South East corner a stone mound for this Survey. Thence North 19 West
 five thousand varas to the south West corner of W. S. Parker Survey a Post and stone mound
 from which a Post oak bears South 53 East 28 vrs; another 9" dia: bears 21 East 8 varas. Thence
 South 71 West two thousand five hundred varas to the North West corner at a Post from which
 a Live oak 18" dia bears due East 31 1/2 varas and another L.O. bears S. 66 West 15 varas. Thence
