

State of Texas } Field notes of a survey of the boundary
Carson County } line between Armstrong and
Dowley Counties, Texas:-

Friday March 29th 1901.

Begin at the stone monument 2½ ft. base and 5½ ft. high, marking the common corner to Carson, Gray, Dowley and Armstrong Counties. Thence on trial line parallel to the previously established West line of Armstrong County. South 30 miles to a point from which a stone and earth mound (with stone in center, marked S.W. DC - S.E. A.C.) is S 84¼ N. 2007 vs. said stone and earth mound being identified as marking the S.E. corner of Armstrong and the S.W. corner of Dowley Counties, by the above described marked stone and bearings as follows:- C.W. 15' dia, N. 79° 43' E 2970 vs. Another C.W. N. 85° 2' E. Prominent point of plain N. 58° 58' W. From the above described S.E. corner of Dowley and S.E. corner of Armstrong Counties run North on course necessary to connect same by straight line, with the common ^{Corner} corner to Carson, Gray, Dowley and Armstrong Counties as follows:- North (variation 7° 35' E) - 140 vs deep creek - (E) - 1900.8 vs earth mound 2 ft. high and 2 pits and iron pipe 1½ x 36" marked 1-29-A-D. on high level land for first mile

North. 1793 vs E & W. road - 1900.8 vs earth mound 2 ft. high and 2 pits and iron pipe 1½ x 36" marked 2-28-A-D. for 2nd mile.

North. 453 vs wagon road (S.W.) 850 vs road (N.W.) 1117½ vs E & W. fence 3 wire - 1900.8 vs earth mound 2 ft. high and 2 pits and iron pipe 1½ x 36" marked 27-3-B-A - for 3rd mile.

North 72 vs North fence of field - 130 vs deep ravine (E) 586½ vs calf corral. 636 vs North fence of formal and South of orchard + garden, from which point windmill is N. 75° W. - 60 vs 735 vs North fence of garden - 1157 vs 3 wire E & W. fence - 1195 vs

- North-600 vs South Mulberry Creek (E) - 1200 vs ft. in bottom of deep cañon - 1900.8 vs earth and stone md. marked AXD on East side of small ravine (S 70° E) for 9th mile.
- North-1900.8 vs earth and stone md. 2ft. high gypsum stone in center marked AXD for 10th mile.
- North-465 vs wagon road (SE) 750 vs bluff South bank of Mulberry Creek - 1020 vs Channel of Creek - 1900.8 vs earth and stone md. and 2 pits and iron pipe $1\frac{1}{2} \times 36$ " marked 11-17-A-D for 11th mile.
- North-838 vs ft. from which S.E. corner sec. 32, A-G. Blk 93 is S. 68° E - 1021 vs - 1900.8 vs earth md. 2ft. high and 2 pits and iron pipe $1\frac{1}{2} \times 36$ " marked 12-18-A-D on North slope of high, sharp divide for 12th mile.
- North-570 vs deep cañon at 1000 vs + 1520 vs cross cañons (S.W.) 1900.8 vs earth md. 2ft. high and 2 pits and iron pipe $1\frac{1}{2} \times 36$ " marked 13-17-A-D on high divide for 13th mile.
- North-1571 vs E+W. 4 wire fence 1900.8 vs earth md. 2ft. high and iron pipe $1\frac{1}{2} \times 36$ " marked 14-16-A-D on top of ridge and 20 vs East of ravine for 14th mile.
- North-300 vs Creek (E) - 1900.8 vs earth md. 2ft. high and 2 pits and iron pipe $1\frac{1}{2} \times 36$ " marked 15-15-A-D at foot of small ridge slope to South 15th mile.

North-1614 1/2 vs-4 wire south fence of field from which point the S.E. Corner of sec. 51 Blk. 133. H. & G. N. R.R. Co is West 362 vs 1900. 8 via the stone monument marking the Corner to Carson, Gray, Donley and Armstrong Counties, at the place of beginning.
