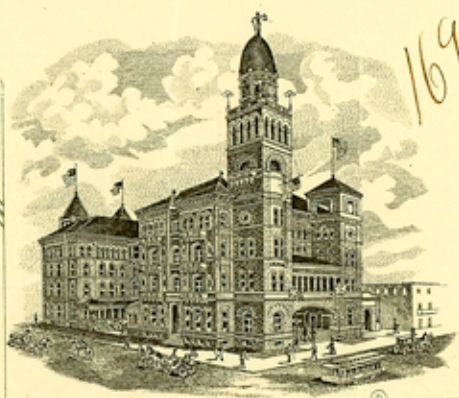

Whereas the Commrs. Court of Atascosa County has entered an order to survey and establish the boundary line between Atascosa & Bexar Counties, and has notified the Commrs. Court of Bexar Co. of such order by sending to this Court a certified copy of such order.

Now therefore it is ordered that W. M. Locke, County Surveyor of Bexar Co, an experienced and competent practical surveyor be and is hereby appointed to proceed on the 16th day of Dec., 1901 to survey said line beginning at the West corner of Wilson County, located near the S cor. of the Jas. R. Burt survey No. 1420-- thence in a direct line to a point on the E. line of Medina County, five miles south of the Medina River, there establishing the N. W. corner of Atascosa Co. and S. W. corner of Bexar Co. and said surveyor shall in all things conform to law as prescribed for the running, marking and establishing of County Boundaries and corners.

And whereas it is advisable that said line be run and established at the earliest practicable day, it is therefore ordered that the time required for the service of notice of said order of Atascosa County is waived and acceptance is hereby made and said surveyor Locke is ordered to proceed to survey said line on the 16th day of Dec. 1901 the day designated by the Commrs Court of Atascosa for the beginning of said survey.

The said surveyor Locke in running said line is ordered to connect with the nearest original corner of all original survey lines crossed by said line, giving course and distance from all such original corners so connected.

It appearing to the Court that the boundary line between Atascosa and Bexar Counties is not sufficiently definite and well defined: It is therefore the order of this Court that E. B. Brown, an experienced and competent practical surveyor, be and he is here by appointed to make and establish said line in the manner prescribed by law; he shall give bond in the sum of One Thousand Dollars and take the oath of office prescribed by law for county surveyors, and after being duly qualified, shall, on the 16th day of December 1901, begin said survey at the West corner of Wilson County located near the south corner of the Jas. R. Burt Survey No. 1420, a mesquite post marked B.A.W., from which a P.O. 16 in. in dia. marked A. brs. S. 6-1/2 E.; another 15 in. in dia. marked B. brs. N. 24 E. 29-1/2 vrs.; another 13 in. in dia. marked W. brs. N. 80-1/2 E. 33-1/2 vrs., as established by W. T. Sutherland in 1885. Thence in a direct line to a point on the East line of Medina County line, Five miles South of the Medina river, there establishing the North-west corner of Atascosa County and the South-west corner of Bexar County, and said surveyor shall in all things conform to the law as prescribed for the running, marking and designating of county boundaries and corners.

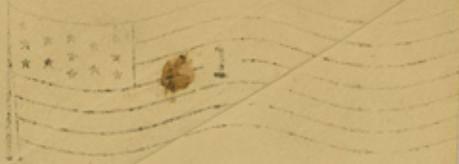

9 the needle was found to be near eastern extremi-

10 ty of line about $8^{\circ}-44'$ East, and $8^{\circ}-47'$ East

11 near Western extremity. Survey was begun on

12 16th day of December, 1901, and was continued

13 from day to day (except Sundays and Dec.

14 23rd, 24th and 25th), until finished on

15 Jan. 21st 1902. The monuments marking the

16 mile-points were found distributed into

17 three or four piles along the boundary

18 line, and they were placed in their proper posi-

19 tions (according to the system of marks and

20 numbering already devised and cut on them)

Thence S 68° 46' E. at 887 vrs E. Line of Sur N° 439 Wm Klemke 308 vrs from its S.E. cor. at 1127 vrs dry pond, at 1853 1/4 vrs. cross E. line of M. Bailey 861 vrs. from its Ell cor. & 286 5/10 vrs from its S.E. cor. at 1900 3/10 vrs. set Stone Monument N° 5 being 22 miles from E. extremity of this County Line.

The Boundary Line between Bexar County & Medina County was retraced and resurveyed by both myself & Mr. Locke and the point 5 miles South of the Medina River on said line was established by us, both agreeing as to the exact point.

The upper corner of Sur. No. 25, Wm. C. Howthe & the lower cor. of No. 26, Julian Cortes, being a common point was not recognized & identified by Bearings originally given although an exhaustive Survey and research was made, but a point was found that has repeatedly been recognized and adopted & officially described by many different County Surveyors & relocators as the common cor. of said Surveys. The Bearings thus called for, are an Elm S 64° W. $34\frac{1}{2}$ vrs. a bearing Elm bro. S 10° W. $3\frac{3}{4}$ vrs.

Thence South along the Bexar & Medina County Line as heretofore established, at 1293 $\frac{7}{10}$ vrs. the center of G. H. & S. A. R. R. & passing the several Mile Stone monuments on said line at 5 miles placed the Initial Stone being the N. W. cor. of Atascosa County & S. W. cor. of Bexar County, & marked "W. II. 1." (West Initial No. 1.) from which the N. W. cor. of Jno. Garner Sur. No. 435 vrs. N $65\frac{1}{2}$ W. $249\frac{7}{10}$ vrs. the "Spencer" house vrs. N. W. the N. E. cor. vrs. N $22^{\circ} 35'$ W. a P. O. tree 23 ins. in dia. vrs. N $34^{\circ} 15'$ W. $49\frac{9}{100}$ vrs.

The angle formed by the intersection of the trial line & the true line at N. E. cor. of Atascosa County was found to be $28^{\circ} 7'$ of arc.

The N. W. cor. of Atascosa Co. having been thus established and the true course to connect said N. W. cor. on a direct line with its N. E. cor. as heretofore described



1 in good condition the Chain used was
2 a Ten Vara steel tape made by Justis Roe.
3 Both Surveying instruments were used as were both
4 chains on the same line with great care,
5 painstaking and close scrutiny. Care was
6 taken at each setting of the transit to elimin-
7 ate instrumental conditions affecting the ac-
8 curate prolongation of a straight line. After
9 setting the forward flag and point, and remov-
10 ing my instrument, Mr. Locke, Surveyor for Bex-
11 ar County, occupied the station and observed
12 the course and thus each sight was thoroughly
13 tested by both Surveyors as was the line's dist-
14 ance by the two sets of Chain Bearers. The actual
15 course of the trial line near its Eastern extremity,
16 near its middle point, and near its Western extrem-
17 ity, was found by measuring the angle that said
18 line made with the true meridian at said points,
19 the true meridian being found by observation
20 of Polaris at its culmination. Near its Eastern
21 extremity the course of the trial line was $N 68^{\circ} - 04' W$,
22 near its middle point $N 68^{\circ} - 12' W$, and near
23 western extremity, $N 68^{\circ} - 18' W$. The above ob-
24 servations for azimuth of the trial line were made
25 in order to see if any error of a serious nature
26 was made in the prolongation of the
27 straight line. The end of each mile from
28 the beginning point was marked for points
29 of offset to the true line. At 2.5 miles and
30 1628 ^{the trial line} vrs ~~the~~ intersected the East boundary
31 of Medina County at a point 4 miles
32 and 1468 ⁵/₁₀ vrs. South of the Medina River
