Be it known that on this the 5th day of August, 1907, the same being the first Monday in said Month, there was begun and holden a regular term of the Honorable County Court in and for Live Oak county, Texas, at the Court House in the town of Oakville, there being present the Honorable W. A. Hill, County Judge, presiding, W. H. Lewis, Sheriff, and C. F. Allen, Clerk of said Court, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:--

In the matter of the boundary line between Live Oak and Atascosa Counties.

On this 5th day of August, 1907, came on to be considered by the Court the report of R. W. Fenner, heretofore appointed by this Court and duly qualified to survey the boundary line between Live Oak and Atascosa Counties, showing how he has discharged his duties as such, which said report consists of the field notes and map of said line as surveyed and marked by said Fenner and Calvin Bass, the latter a surveyor acting in behalf of said Atascosa County, and it appearing to the Court from an inspection and examination thereof that said report is correct and that said boundary was surveyed in conformity with law, said report is here now in all things approved and ordered recorded in the Minutes of this Court; and it is further ordered that the Clerk of this Court make a certified copy of said report and cause the same to be transmitted to the Commissioner of the General Land Office at Austin:

Wherefore it is ordered by the Court that said boundary line be and the same is hereby fixed and established in accordance with said survey, field notes and plat, as follows:

To the Hon. W. A. Hill,
County Judge Live Oak County, Texas.

Sir: On February 6th., 1907, I was appointed by your Honorable County Court to survey, mark and establish the Northwest boundary line and the Northwest corner of Live Oak County, said line being the boundary line between Live Oak and Atascosa Counties, and as such surveyor I beg leave to submit the following report and map:

On Monday, May 20th, 1907, I met Mr. Calvin Bass, county surveyor of Atascosa County, and representing said Atascosa County in said boundary Line Survey, in the town of Karnes City, Karnes County, Texas, for the purpose of agreeing upon some method or plan for running said boundary line.

The United States Coast and Geodetic Survey has placed a true North and South line in the Court House Square at Karnes City, and the meridian established by the Government for the purpose of determining the magnetic declination of the compass needle, being, our judgment, the most practical manner of getting the exact declination or variation of the needle, we agreed to place a W. & L. E. Gurley five-inch Surveyor's Transit upon said meridian and the variation given, which was North $3^{\circ} 53'$ East, was used.

On the 22nd. day of May, 1907, we began on the right bank of the San Antonio river opposite and about 40 varas S. 50° W. from the mouth of Cibolo Creek and ran a line S. 50° W. 33,894.7 varas intersecting the Southwest boundary line of Karnes County and there established the East corner of Atascosa County and the North corner of Live Oak County, which is a large mesquite post marked L. A., 1175 varas S. $40^{\circ} 12'$ E. of the 8th. mile post on said Karnes County boundary. From said large post a point on the North boundary line of Survey No. 244 in the name of John Glover bears N. $40^{\circ} 12'$ W. 1065- $\frac{1}{2}$ varas and from said
