Dear Sir: The warranted field-notes of a county line run by W. C. Richards and Louis Falk, were filed in this office June 12th, 1884. The line does not conform to the law establishing county boundaries, and have not been approved. See appendix to statute, pages 24 & 25.

The line between Bandera and Kerr Counties is about fifty miles long, and for the entire distance there is not more than half dozen corners of surveys through which the county line passes called for. I am very anxious to have the county lines conform to law, so that the lines may be definite and final, and that the abstract may be permanently corrected. Will your commissioners court have the line between Kerr & Bandera retraced by your county surveyor and the surveyor of Kerr Co., and connect the county line to end or more corners of each survey through which the line passes. The field-notes of the line now in this office are of but little use.

Your field-notes between Bandera and Medina and Uvalde seem to be satisfactory.
