Be it remembered, that on Monday the 14th, day of August A.D. 1893; there came on and was held a regular session of the Honorable Commissioners Court of Briscoe County at the Court House of said County, in the town of Silverton, Present, Honorable, J. M. Stallard, County Judge, presiding; S. P. Husa, Commissioner of Precinct No. one; John Gady Commissioner of Precinct No. Two; Vernon Wilkinson Commissioner of Precinct No. Three; M. L. Malone Commissioner of Precinct No. Four; J. L. Anderson, County Clerk and Minor Crawford Sheriff.

Tuesday 15th of Aug. 1893.

It appearing to the Court that the boundary line of Briscoe County between the Counties of Donley and Armstrong is not sufficiently definite, and well defined. It is therefore ordered by the court that Nat G. Walker County surveyor of Briscoe County, Texas, be and is hereby appointed to ascertain by actual survey, the boundary of said Briscoe County said boundary being the line between Briscoe County and the Counties of Donley and Armstrong and also to establish and mark the N. E. and N. W. corners of Briscoe County in the manner prescribed by law, and it is further ordered that said County surveyor proceed to the N. E. corner of Briscoe County on the 1st day of Dec. 1893 for the commencement of said survey, and it is ^{further} ordered by the Court that a copy of this order be sent by the County Clerk of Briscoe County to each of the Courts of Donley and Armstrong in time prescribed by law.

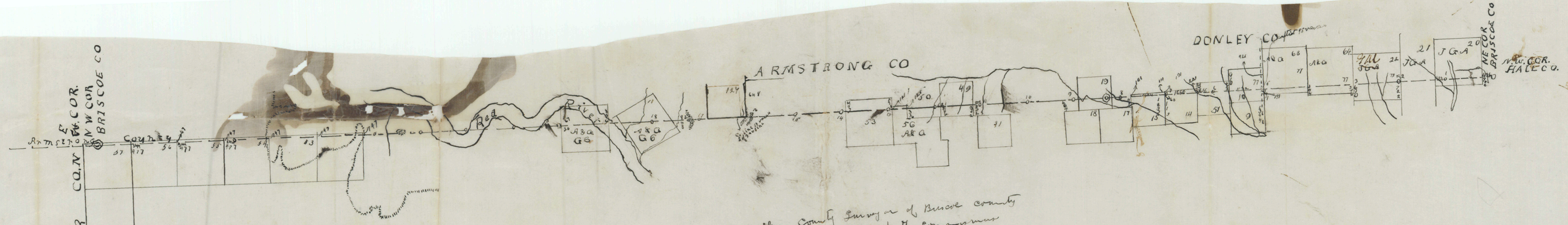

Nos 6 & 22 was

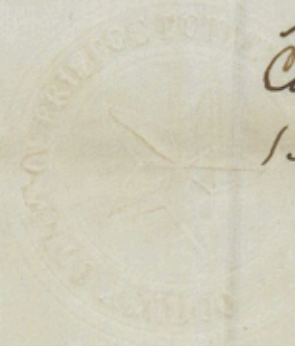
