

Survey of the County Boundary of Burnet
County, Beginning on the West Corner of
Old Carthage's League No 4 on the North
San Gabriel at a Stone Mound from which
I took a Live Oak marked B. C. bears N. 26° E
1000 Varas Run S 26° West at 3 Miles and
1100 Varas crossed Bear Creek, a branch of the
San Gabriel, at 4 Miles crossed Georgetown
Road leading to Hamilton at 6 Miles 1100 Varas
crossed South San Gabriel at 7 Miles 1370 Varas
crossed Hunter Road to Hamilton at 10 Miles
1530 Varas crossed South prong of the South
Gabriel at 12 Miles 1300 Varas crossed the
Dividing Ridge between the Brazos and Colorado
Rivers at 15 Miles 1300 Varas crossed Cow
Creek formerly called Fish Creek at 21 Miles
1500 Varas struck the Colorado River, on the
Lang Survey 1700 Varas with the Mounds
above the Lower Corner of said Survey Made a
Stone Corner between the mouths of 2 small
branches on a rise from which a Live Oak
marked B. C. bears N. 84° E 5 Varas distant
thence across the Colorado River and down
the west bank to the lower Corner of Williams
Survey thence South to the S. E. Corner of
the same Survey No 19 thence S 30° W
at 4 Miles 1100 Varas, crossed Little Cypress
of Dardanelles here connects with the N. E.
Corner of Survey 107 S 75° W 530 Varas at 7
Miles 950 Varas crossed Big Cypress Creek
at 8 Miles 1000 Varas, Made a Stone
Corner on the N. E. Line of Mays County from
which a Live Oak marked B. C. bears South
70° W 27 Varas another Live Oak bears S.
85° E 38 Varas marked C thence N 50° W

 Marked X bears S 21° W 1/2 Varas and a Black
 Jack Marked, I, bears N 46° E 33 Varas, thence
 with Maps N.W. boundary S 46° W at 2 Miles
 370 Varas crossed Cypress Creek at 2 Miles
 1058 Varas struck a live running N & S,
 line connects with this Survey Run South 700 Varas
 found a Stone Corner from which a Live Oak
 Marked X bears N 13° E 18 Varas another
 Live Oak Marked X bears N 9° W 22 Varas -
 Thence run from this Corner South 1323 Varas
 found another Stone Corner from which a Live
 Oak Marked X bears N 25° E 12 Varas another
 Live Oak Marked X bears N 18° E 21/2 Varas
 thence run to give the White League (having only
 a . . . to run by run East 1600 vs. then
 South 1100 Varas, then East 900 Varas hunt
 around for some time could find no Lines, nor
 corners quit it up, returned back took up my
 line S 16° W at 5 Miles 1200 Varas crossed
 South prong of Cypress Creek at 8 Miles made
 a Stone Corner from which a Live Oak Marked
 X bears 35 N 23 vs. Another Live Oak
 Marked X^m bears N 1/4° W 30 Varas, this corner
 stands on the west side of a small branch of the
 Perdennes, surrounded by Round Heads on the west
 and N.W. Thence run west at 3 Miles 1600 Varas
 crossed a branch of the Perdennes, this branch
 runs through a very rough Post Oak Hilley
 Rocky Country at 5 Miles 380 Varas crossed
 another considerable branch heavy Post Oak
 Country a narrow belt of Prairie on this branch

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29 miles 950 varas made a Stone Corner from which a Black Jack marked BC bear N 78 W. 27 varas, another Black Jack marked BC bear N 49 W. 23 varas. This Corner stands of Rising Ground surrounded by Black Jack & Post Oak growth. Thence run S 30 E.

2. miles 1070 varas crossed the Lampasas

4. " 280 " the Fort Gaty Road

5. " 1500 " crossed a Large & Bushy Rocky Branch of the Lampasas

10 miles 860 varas made a Stone Corner from which a Live oak marked BC bear S 4 W. 42 varas, another Live Oak marked BC bear N 43 W 53 varas. This Corner stands some half mile East of two Round mounds Thence run S 45 W at

4 miles crossed Berries Creek of the San Gabriel

8 " 1670 varas crossed the north prong of the San Gabriel

10 " 750 " to the Place of Beginning

3 miles 1100 varas crossed a Branch of the Pordunales, this branch runs through a very rough Country - Post Oak Hilly & Rocky

5 miles 380 varas crossed another Considerable Branch Heavy Post Oak Country a narrow Strip of Prairie on this Branch look for but could not find any line

6 miles made a Stone Corner on the west Side of a large Granite Rock from which a Black Jack marked H bears S 21 W. 10 varas, another Black Jack marked H bears N 49 W 13 varas. I could not find the old Franco & Bexar line but am satisfied that I have crossed it. The last Corner stands in a Post oak valley - a Range of Knobs on the Dividing Ridge between the Pordunales and Sandy Water, bearing North of this place

Thence N. 17 E with said line to the Colorado River - Thence across the River and up the East Bank with the meandering to the upper Corner of the Sally House League No 14 a Stake on the Bank of the River from which an Elm marked X bears East 6 varas, and a Box Elder marked X bears S 17 E. 8 varas, Thence East at

5 miles 1520 varas crossed Road leading from Fort Croghan to Phantom Hill

5 " 1100 " " Dividing Ridge between the Brazos and Colorado

6 " 1080 " South prong of the Lampages

8 " 1300 " recrossed the same

11 " 1350 " crossed another large Branch of the Lampages

20 " 400 " crossed Murgent Creek

23 " 1000 " crossed another Branch of Lampages

24 " 1500 " passed same 50 varas South of an old Corner from which a Live oak marked H bears S. 74 E. 55 varas - and another Live oak marked H bears S 78 E. 70 varas

25 miles 200 varas crossed the Lampages

Live oak bear, S 85 E. 38 varas, marked C

2 " 1058 " struck a line running N. and S. here I connected
with this Survey Run South

7/14 varas found a Stone Corner from which a Live oak marked X
bears N 13 E 18 varas, another Live oak marked X bears N 9 W
22 varas, Thence run from this Corner South 1323 varas found
another Stone Corner from which a Live Oak marked X
bears N 48 E. 24 varas - Live Oak marked X bears N 25 E. 12 varas

hunted round for some time could find no lines nor corners

10 " 1530 " " South wing of the San Gabriel

12 " 1300 " " dividing Ridge between the Brazos and

15 " 1300 " " Cow Creek formerly called Fish Creek

21 " 1500 " " crossed the Colorado River on the

As the District Surveyor of Travis is now absent in the woods and knowing that your draftsman is now busily engaged in making up a map of Travis and as the information contained in Carveys Letter of the 14 May (received only this morning thanks to our beautiful Mail facilities) and the accompanying sketch - must be of essential service - I thought it best to forward it at once to you - as you could make the best use of it that you might think fit

If the old Corners of the Milam Surveys could be recognised - it would fix to a certainty the Connection between the Work of Travis and Milam Land districts a thing very much to be desired - There is one thing to be observed that Willbarger always had the reputation of making his Surveys too large this may account for some ^{apparent} errors in plotting -

Should you require these Documents to be sent in to you in a different shape by giving my Partner Mr Frazer proper instructions you may depend upon his having them properly attended to. Please let me hear from you on this subject at your earliest possible Conve-
mence -

Road at 5 Miles 1500 Varas crossed a Large Bluffy Rocky branch of the Llanos at 10 Miles 800 Varas Made a Stone Corner, from which a Line Calk marked B C bears S 1/2 N 1/2 W 53 Varas another Line Calk marked B C bears N 1/2 W 53 Varas. This Corner stands some half mile East of 2 Round Mounds. Thence Run S 1/2 W at 1/2 Miles crossed Perry's Creek of the San Gabriel at 10 Miles 750 Varas to the place of beginning this Survey commenced 25th day of October and ended the 8th day of May 1853.
