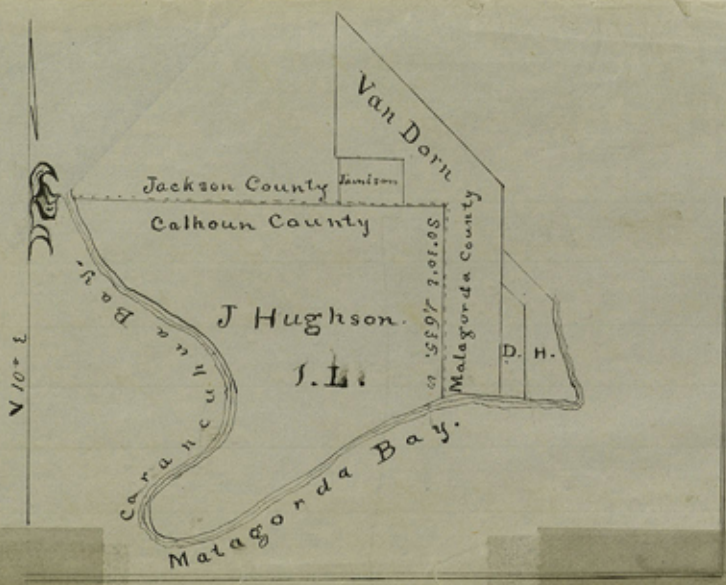

Letter from Chief Justice as  
to Boundaries of Calhoun Co.



State of Texas  
 Calhoun County

The undersigned being appointed by the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the County Court of said County to mark and establish the boundaries of Calhoun County in conjunction with the Commissioner of Matagorda County commencing in accordance with an order of the aforesaid Court on Monday the 7<sup>th</sup> day of June, <sup>1852</sup> on arriving at the N.E. Corner of J. Hughson's Survey there being no Commissioner on the part of Matagorda County the undersigned proceeded to establish the aforesaid boundaries.

Beginning at Hughson's N.E. corner a post in prairie  
 Thence S 0° 30' E. 4635 M to the bank of Matagorda Bay a post  
 marked M.C. Thence S 10° 30' W across Matagorda Bay about  
 16 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>10</sub> miles to the extreme western point of the Peninsula 18 <sup>4</sup>/<sub>10</sub>  
 miles to the East point of Pelican Island being the extreme South  
 point of Matagorda and S.E. point of Calhoun County

The undersigned being appointed by the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. the County Court of said County to mark and Establish the boundaries of Calhoun County in conjunction with the Commissioner of Victoria County in accordance with an Order of said Court and on the day appointed being the first Monday and the 7<sup>th</sup> day of June 1852 at the north corner of V. Garcia's Survey there being no Commissioner on the part of Victoria County. The undersigned proceeded to mark and Establish the aforesaid boundary Beginning on the west bank of Union Creek or Bayou (called Placidore creek) a post from which the N.E. side of the mouth of said Bayou at its junction with La Vaca Bay bears S 71° E about 300 vs. - Thence S 55° W 4750 vs. to La Vaca Road 6784 with the N.W. boundary of said Garcia to its termination Thence S 55° 57' W. 441 vs to the La Vaca Turnpike Road 7156 vs to Chocolate Creek near <sup>and through</sup> the lower end of the millous on said creek 9416 vs to River Road to Port La Vaca 11386 vs. to Port La Vaca Road 12426 vs. to Indianola Road 13514 vs. to the S.E. corner of J.M. Rios Survey. - Thence S 55° W with Rios S.E. boundary 2632 vs to Indianola Road 2940 vs. to Indianola Road 5812 to Road from Victoria to Green Lake 7600 vs to Edge of Marsh 12205 vs to the bank of the Guadalupe River a post from which a forked Elm 10 inches in diameter MK<sup>d</sup> + bears N 6° W 3 vs. and a Mulberry 12 inches in dia MK<sup>d</sup> + bears N 36° W 1 vs. being the termination of the Boundary of Victoria and Calhoun Counties

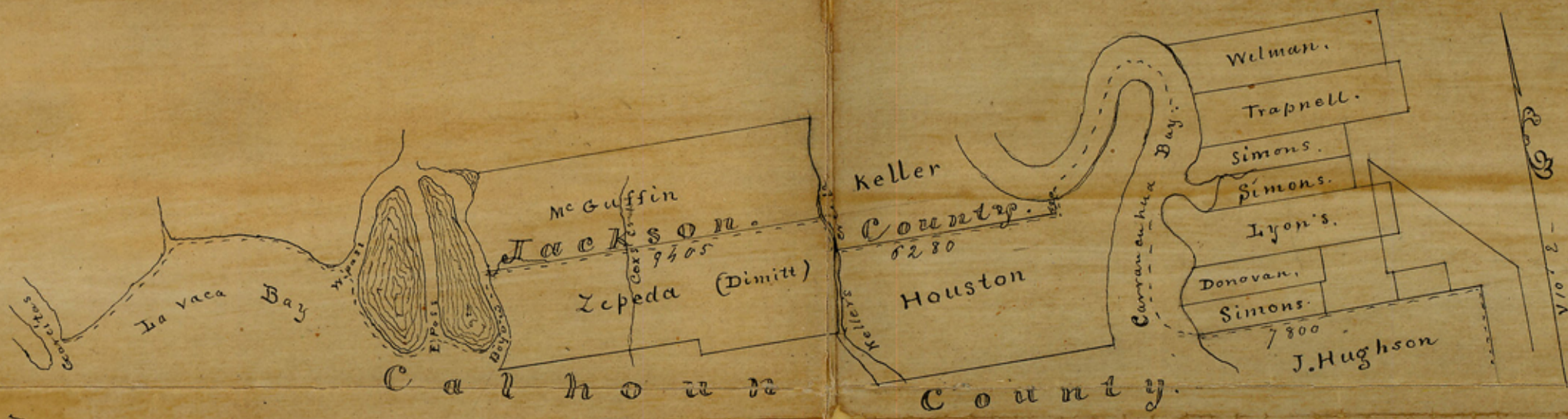

The undersigned being appointed by the Hon. the County Court of said County to run and mark the lines of Calhoun County in conjunction with the Commission on the part of Jackson County in accordance with an Order of said Court and on the day appointed being the first Monday and the 7<sup>th</sup> day of June 1852 at the north corner of V. Garcia's Survey the Commissioners of Jackson County not being present the undersigned proceeded to mark and establish the aforesaid boundaries as follows

Beginning at the north margin of the Garcitas Creek at its junction with La Vaca Bay thence with the meanders of said Bay to <sup>a point on</sup> the East margin of a Bayou leading from La Vaca River to La Vaca Bay <sup>distance 11500 m East from the place of beginning</sup> being the actual corner of the surveys made for Mc Guffin and Dimmitt (apart of Zepeda) a post on the bank to the <sup>small Bayou</sup> thicket from which a Brazil wood 3 inches in dia. marked; bears N 61° 30' E 19 1/2 bars and another Brazil wood 3 inches in dia. marked; bears N 30° W 15 1/2 bars. Thence N 89° 30' E with the line of Mc Guffin and Dimmitt 3630 m to Cox's Creek 9405 bars to Keller's Creek a post Thence down Kelley Creek with its meanders on its East margin S 18° E 500 bars thence S 41° W 604 m to Houston and Kelley corner on said creek a stake. Thence N 89° 30' E with the line dividing Houston and Kelley survey 6280 m. Thence N 20° 30' W 490 m with Houston and Kelley dividing line to the bank of Carancubua Bayou a post. Thence down said Bayou with its meanders to a point on the opposite side of said Carancubua Bayou or Bay the same being the west corner of a Survey made for James Hughson. same saplings marked in the northern end of the lower or southernmost lot Thence N 89° 30' E with the North boundary of said Hughson's survey 7800 bars to his N.E. corner being the western boundary of the County of Matagorda and the <sup>S.E.</sup> termination of that of Jackson
