Dear Sir:

Your letter of May 19th addressed to Mr Geo H Shepard, Comptroller, has been handed to this department for attention. You request abstract showing the last survey between Cochran and Bailey counties, and I presume you are referring to such abstract which would be made by virtue of the A L Harris resurvey of the line between the two counties above mentioned.

When the report from Mr Harris was received, it was examined and abstract of surveys along that line was started. Before its completion, however, the Commissioners' court of Lamb county questioned the correctness of the South line of Lamb county as run by Mr Harris. It appears that they wished to stand on the Tilson line. The effect of this is to throw into controversy the SW line of Lamb county as to its position East and West, as well as North and South. The Harris line is a little further South and does not extend as far West as the Tilson line.

Until this difficulty is straightened out, I do not see how this office can correct the abstract of surveys along the South line of Bailey county.

I shall refer you to the court decree under which all these county lines were defined. You will note then the reason for my hesitating to change the abstract of surveys along the South line of Bailey county, at this time.
