Beginning at a post and pile of
Rocks in the prairie on the head wat-
ters of Stampede Creek the N^W
corner of Bell County for the S. E.
corner of Coryell county from which
~~There~~ a Willow in the creek brs S 87
& 780 varras Thence N 30^W 15 miles
to a post & pile of Rocks on a branch of
Wasp creek Thence S 60^W at 3 miles &
880 varras passed a live oak live tree in
a grove head of Spring creek 5 miles 100
varras Coryell's creek at 11 miles 950 varras
crossed Leon 16 miles to a pile of Rocks on
the head of Snake creek from which a
Spanish Oak 8 in in diameter Mt'd H. brs
S 78 & 14 varras for the center of Coryell
County.
