Jarrant County was created by law December the 20th 1849, and is constructed upon the west boundary line of Dallas County. The Northwest and Southwest corners of Dallas County, being the North east corner and South east corner of Jarrant County; since the Northwest corner and the Southwest corner of Dallas County must first be established, and the line connecting these two corners will be the correct legal boundary line between said Dallas and Jarrant Counties:

In pursuance of this theorem we began at the initial point or corner of Dallas County as marked and defined by Warren S. Farris in the year of 1850, as appears of Record in Dallas County, which point we consider best and most reliable date for the location of the Northeast corner of Dallas County,

From this point we ran west following the old Farris County line as defined and marked by Mr. Orr, the special Surveyor under the act of December the 1st 1849, and at the end of 56.702 yards or $29\frac{8}{100}$ miles N $89^{\circ} 11' W$ from the beginning point we planted in the ground a Bois d'arc post 8 inches square three feet in the ground and four feet above ground for the Northwest corner of Dallas County.

From this point we ran south 57825.50 to a point 30 miles south and 30 miles west from the initial point on the Northeast corner of Dallas County and established the Southwest corner of Dallas County and the

Dallas County and consequently the East boundary
line of Tarrant County, have filed with your office
a copy of our report made to our respective County

the legal boundary line of Dallas and Tarrant counties.

"Dallas County was created by law March the
30th AD 1846 having its initial or beginning point
in the South boundary line of Harris County a said
line existed by law at that time, and then miles
east of the intersection of the line with East
boundary line of Peters Colony, and was constructed
with its North and South lines parallel lines and
its east and west lines longitudinal parallel lines.

The North boundary line was subsequently modified
by an act of the legislature number the 1st 1849 (see
Hartley's Digest article 2294) The special Surveyor
appointed under this act, to mark and define the
Southwest boundary line of Harris County made
this survey, marked and defined the line, made his
report to the commissioners of the General Land
Office at Austin and it was adopted. The line so
marked and defined is not a true East and West line,
but is $7^{\circ}8'9''W$ from the initial point of Dallas
County, though a legal line by the act of December

3 We located for the S.W. corner of Dallas County
4 and the S.E. corner of Tarrant County a Bois d'arc
5 post 8 inches square, three feet in the ground and
6 two and a half feet above the ground. We marked
7 said post on its west side S.E.C.T.C. and on its
8 east side S.W.C.D.C. said post stands at the foot
9 of north side of a ridge and at the S.E. edge of
10 Mountain Creek Valley from which a Mesquite
