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Dear Sir: -

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I have yours of April 24th enclosing carbon copy of a letter to Mr. W. R. Gibson at Cleude, Texas.

In your letter you refer me to Mr. Gibson's letter for the information that I asked you to furnish me in my letter to you of the 17th. I am very sorry to day that it is necessary that I refer you to my letter of the 17th in which I asked you if I was not correct in my idea of the correct location of the west boundary line of Donley County.

I am very well aware of the fact that this line was run a number of years ago, and I also know beyond doubt, as do the Commissioners of both Donley and Armstrong Counties, that the Southwest corner of Donley County as located, as you say by Mr. Gray, is about three miles West and 30 miles South of the Northwest corner of Donley County.



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Commissioners:

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The idea of the Commissioners of the two Counties before mentioned is to establish the <u>correct</u> line between the two Counties, and not to retrace any old and erroneous lines.

My idea of the correct location of the said line is to begin at the 42nd mile post on the 100th meridian and run west 60 miles for the N.W. corner of Donley County, thence South 30 miles for the S.W.corner.

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Please advise me at once if this is not correct.

Dear Sir:

I have been employed by the Commissioners Court of Donley County to locate the line between Donley and Armstrong Counties, and am writing you with a view of securing some information inregard thereto.

As I understand it, the proper way to locate this line would be to start at the 42nd. mile post on the 100th. Meridian, go west sixty miles, thence south parallel to 100th. Meridian 30 miles. Is this the correct way to locate same? If not, will you not kindly advise?

I wish to start this work about the 21st. or 22nd. of this month, and will, therefore, very much appreciate the information at as early a date as possible.
