Dear Sir:

In accordance with your letter of March 6, 1954, we have mailed to you under separate cover a copy of the Armstrong County Map, upon which we have depicted the Donley - Armstrong County line.

The line shown was surveyed by J. L. Grey during March 1901, and the field notes were filed in this office May 6, 1901. They are of record in Volume 1, pages 263 to 274, in the Minutes of the Commissioner's Court of Armstrong County.

Another survey of this boundary line was made in June of 1914 by R. G. Caraway and Frank Elston. The field notes of this survey were filed for record September 9, 1914, in the Minutes of the County Court of Donley County, Volume 2, pages 253 to 254.

This line apparently was never approved and according to an endorsement on the field notes, appears to have been located about a mile East of the true position for same.

The survey made by Grey and which we have shown was very unsatisfactory and incomplete. Only one tie was made along the entire line, this to the SE corner of Section 32, Block G-3; therefore, for abstracting purposes, the survey is of little value.
