Field notes of a survey establishing the East boundary of Lasalle County, the West and South boundaries of Mc'Mullen County, and the North boundary of Duval County, the South boundary of Live Oak County from the S. E. corner of Mc'Mullen county to the N. E. corner of Duval and N. W. corner of Nueces Counties, made by the order and concurrent action of the Commissioners Courts of Duval, Nueces, Live Oak, and Mc'Mullen Counties and their respective Surveyors, under instructions and orders of the corresponding Courts of these Counties,

Beginning at the upper corner of a survey in the name of Wm. C. Hawth assignee of Maria Jesusa Hernandez and lower corner of survey No. 26 in the name Julia Boutel on the South margin of Medina river, whence a Sycamore 11 in in diameter marked $\overline{\overline{M}}$ bears S. $47\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W 8° and another 10 in in diameter marked $\overline{\overline{B}}$ bears S. 47° E. 8° , it being the nearest starting point accurately defined and established by law, (as see Paschal's Digest Vol 1 page 181 article 378)

of a branch of the San Maguel, near the divide
between said branch and the San; an open prairie
