A careful examination has been made of the plat and field notes submitted, covering the survey of the Ellis Johnson County line, as made by W. A. Spalding, Special Surveyor for Ellis County, and T. J. Palm, County Surveyor of Johnson County, between March 6, 1939, and July 18, 1939. The field notes and plat appear to be satisfactory in every respect, and only a few minor corrections appear to be necessary in the acreage and the division of same.

The patented field notes of the David Smith survey call for 607 1/3 acres, J. D. James 80 1/4, Radførd Berry 3453 3/4 acres and the B. F. Howard 297 acres, a comparison of this with the list submitted will show the difference. Accordingly, these surveys with their total acreage and division by counties should be corrected and read as follows:

#### Dear Mr. Giles:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 19th inst., regarding errors found by your office in the Ellis-Johnson County line map and accompanying report of surveyors both dated Nov. 13, 1939, which was filed in the General Land Office in November last.

Our engineer has made a recheck of the items listed in your letter with the following results:

#### DAVID SMITH SURVEY:

You show this survey as of 607.3 acres as against 607 1/3 acres called for in the patent. A recalculation shows 34.9 acres in Johnson County. This taken from your total will leave 572.4 acres in Ellis County.

#### J. D. JAMES SURVEY:

Patent not recorded in Ellis County. Accepting your 80.2 acres, there are 0.5 acres in Ellis County. This leaves 79.7 acres for Johnson County.

#### RADFORD BERRY SURVEY:

The patent on record here calls for  $\frac{3}{4}$  League and 1 Labor. We calculate this as 3498.4 acres. A recalculation of our data shows 1715.2 acres in Ellis County. The balance for Johnson County, therefore, would be 1783.2 acres. Our map and report of Nov. 13, 1939 omitted the Labor from the acreage.

#### ALLEN LARRISON SURVEY:

We check your total of 1771.3 acres for total this survey. A recalculation of our data shows 95.2 acres for Ellis County. This leaves the balance or 1676.1 for Johnson County.

B. F. HOWARD SURVEY:

. .....

Our map and report of Nov. 13, 1939 erroneously showed this survey to be 320.0 acres, when it should be 297.0 acres. A recalculation shows 34.5 acres to be in Johnson County. The balance or 262.5 acres are in Ellis County.
