Court for the County of Beco, and

It appearing to the satisfaction of the Court,
that boundary line between Precincts this County
and Presidio County should be run and
said line permanently established, and
that this Court has authority under the
law to cause such survey to be made,
the surveyor of Beco County having proposed
to run said line for the sum of Six
hundred \$600⁰⁰, dollars, paid survey
of six hundred dollars is hereby appro-
priated for the payment of such survey.
The same to be made in the manner
to be fixed and agreed upon between this
Court and the surveyor in articles of agree-
ment to be entered into by and between
the parties. But should Presidio County

desire to have the line formally run
by its County Surveyor and the County
Surveyor of the County, and shall there-
ough its Commissioners Court notify
this Court. Then the appropriation above
made shall be null and void, and
such other appropriation shall be made
as shall be by this Court deemed neces-
sary. And a special session of this Court
is hereby ordered to be held on Monday
June the 22nd 1879, at which time a
contract will be made for the survey of
the boundary line between Pecos and
Presidio Counties. And the Clerk of
this Court is hereby instructed to notify
in writing the Commissioners Court
of said Presidio County of the action
of this Court.

There being no further business before
the Court is declared adjourned.

Wednesday July 9th 1879 Court was
suspended to adjournment
the State of Texas

County of Pecos. In the matter of
establishing a line between Pecos and
Presidio Counties, from the mouth of
Delaware Creek where it empties into the
Pecos River to the mouth of San Francisco
River where it empties into the Rio
Grande. - This matter came up to be
heard and was submitted upon the records
of Surveys as the law in regard to the
boundary lines between said Counties,
and divers other proofs submitted and it
appearing to the satisfaction of the Court
that the lines between this County and Presidio
County from the mouth of Delaware Creek
to the mouth of San Francisco River where
it empties into the Rio Grande, are not
sufficiently definite as well defined, it
is therefore ordered adjudged as decided,
that Thomas C. Nelson, County Surveyor
of Pecos County, be and he is hereby App-
pointed, to ascertain by actual survey
the boundary lines between said Pecos

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and Presidio Counties from the mouth of
Delaware Creek when it empties into the
Pecos River to the mouth of San Francisco
River when it empties into the Rio Grande
to be commenced at the mouth of Delaware
Creek when it empties into the Pecos River.
It is further ordered adjudged and decreed that
the said Thomas C. Nelson shall make
an initial point at said mouth of
Delaware Creek when it empties into the
Pecos River and establish and make at said
initial point one certain mound of stone,
not less than two feet high and then proceed
to run all said boundary line in a southerly
direction "as described in an act to organize
the County of Pecos, approved May 3rd 1871"
a distance of one mile and then place
a monument of stone not less than
two feet high, then continue all said
boundary line as designated by said act
to the mouth of San Francisco River when
it empties into the Rio Grande, placing a
stone monument at the end of each and
every mile, not less than two feet high;
between said initial points and said
initial corner to place a mound not less
than two feet high, as describe thereon that
the same is an initial corner.

And it is further ordered adjudged and decreed
that said Surveyor or the Field Notes of said
Surveys shall give an accurate description
of all prominent natural points or objects
crossed by or adjacent to said lines, as well
as of the corners said lines of surveys on or
near said boundaries, and it is further
ordered adjudged and decreed that a
Certified Copy of this Order be sent by
the Clerk of this Court to the County

Court of said Presidio County, doth in
further pursuance of this order it is ordered
that said Thomas O'Wilson proceed to
run said line as hereinbefore directed
and that on the 2nd day of August 1879 he
proceed to Parka Spring for the Commen-
cement of having there and then a meeting with
the Surveyor appointed by said Presidio County
should one be appointed as on the 8th
day of August 1879 he shall commence
running at said initial corner to wit;
The mouth of Galway Creek where it
empties into the Pecos River as aforesaid and
continues from day to day, and that
unless a Surveyor is appointed according to
law by said Presidio County, said Wilson
shall nevertheless proceed to run the established
said boundary line as herein described
the same as is the Surveyor from Presidio
County went previous. And it is further
ordered adjuged and decreed that said
Surveyor take the Oath to file the bond
required by law and when said line shall
have been run as marked as herein
directed, that said Surveyor shall make
a return of the fixed notes and map to
this Court for its further action in the
 premises.

There being no further business before the
Court it was adjourned until the next
regular term.

the surveying of the boundary line between
Pecos and Presidio Counties, and having
been requested to cooperate with Pecos
County in surveying said lines, and
having failed to notify this Court in
any manner or form as to their inten-
tions, and this Court being duly ad-
vised in the premises. It is ordered
and decreed that the boundary lines
between Pecos and Presidio Counties be
run, and that contract be made
with Thomas L. Nelson, County Surveyor
of Pecos County, for the survey of said boundary
lines, and the following is the contract in
the contract made and entered into with
said Thomas L. Nelson, County Surveyor
as aforesaid,

"This agreement made and entered
into on this the 2nd day of June 1879, by and
between the Commissioners Court of Pecos

Page 28 County, Pecos, and the County Surveyor of
said County. Witnesseth:

That for and in consideration of the

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Sum of Six hundred (\$600⁰⁰) ^{Dollars}
to be paid by the County of ~~Boco~~ to
Thomas C. Nelson County Surveyor
of said County. The said Surveyor
hereby agrees to run the boundary
line between Boco and Presidio Counties,
from to and between the various points
mentioned in favor of 1871, in the
act creating Boco County, and entitled
"An act to Organize the County of Boco".

Oahoma, May the 30th 1871, as follows:
"Taking so much of said act as
prescribes the boundary lines between
Boco and Presidio Counties."

Commencing at a point on the
Rio Grande where the River San Fran-
cisco empties into the Rio Grande.

Hence in a Northwesterly direction to
Carlos Spring. Hence Northwest to San-
Martin Spring in the Apache mountains.
Hence North East to the mouth of
Delaware Creek, where it empties
into the Boco River, the County Surveyor
agreeing to place suitable marks easy
to be seen and recognized at all prominent
points along said line, especially at all
crossings of roads and at all springs
and water courses on or near said bound-
ary line.

The Surveyor of said boundary line to
commence work on or before June 20, 1879.
Upon completion of the work, and

the delivery of the Field Notes
hereof to the Commissioners Court
of Bexar County. The Surveyor of Bexar
County, Thomas L. Nelson, shall be
paid the sum of Six hundred (\$600)
dollars as hereinbefore mentioned,
and said payment shall be made in
the following manner, to wit: from
money belonging to the general
fund of Bexar County, provided there
shall be at the date of settlement a
sufficient amount belonging to ^{said}
funds to settle the account. But
should there not be sufficient or
sufficient funds in the general fund
to pay said account when due,
then such amount as may be on hand,
in hands of the County Treasurer, shall
be paid. And a County warrant or war-
rants as may be desired shall be given
for the balance remaining unpaid.
And such warrant or warrants shall
be paid from the first funds received
belonging to the general fund of Bexar
County.
