establish the boundary line
between Tarrant + Presidio County.
The question of surveying the legal
wedges of the survey was discussed
+ argued before + sent to Presidio
+ El Paso Counties, from which
I saw + heard I am firmly of the
belief that the notice regarding
law were then prepared + sent.
Mr. Hale, the surveyor was my former
mate at that time + I saw the
surveyors start out to make the survey -

The San Martin Spring in the
of the mountains, now
claimed by Rivers & El Paso
County, ^{as the original San Martin} was seen
first in said survey. I think
it was named as the starting
point, the San Martin Spring
south of the line of the Texas Pacific
Ry was always pointed out & recog-
nized as the correct corner of
said county ~~was~~

I fully believe the said survey was
made in accordance with the
provisions of the law in such cases.

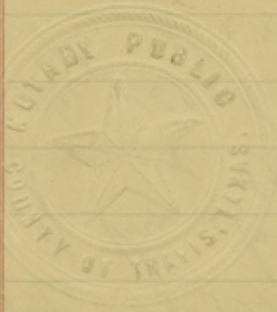
I. G. M. Frazer
being sworn depose and say I
am a resident of Pecos County,
Texas, I was elected and served as
County Judge of Pecos County -
from 1876. to 1880 - and from 1882
to 1884, I remember the survey
of the boundary line between Pecos
and Presidio Counties made at
the instance of Pecos County about 1878 or 1879
The place appointed for the surveyors
to meet was at Bassell's Springs,
The County Court of Presidio
County was notified, according
to law, of the action of the County
Court of Pecos County, I know
the notice was made out and sent,
I afterwards talked with the
County Clerk of said County and
asked why their survey did not
appear to be fair in the survey, He
informed me the notice had been
served but the envelope was addressed
to the Clerk of the County Court and
they did not consider it correct
& claimed it should have been
addressed to the Commissioners
Court. The proceedings were made
and conducted according to law -
My nephew J. W. Barnes was an assistant in
the making of the survey & the line was run on
the ground San Martin spring in the Apache Mountains
as now claimed by Pecos & El Paso County was established

as the correct owner of ~~Rece~~
Pecos, Presidio & El Paso Counties,
and all the proceedings concerning
said survey were had done ac-
cording to law
