San Martin Spring as shown by said
Map being then recognized as the common
Corner of El Paso, Pecos and Presidio
Counties was laid down by him and
said Pressler on said Map after a very
careful and thorough examination
of existing Maps in the General Land Office
and from Topographical sketches and re-
ports made by Officers in the United
States Army which sketches and re-
ports were by efficient in person carefully
compared with original data and other
information to be found at that time in
the Office of the Chief Engineering Officer
of the Department of Texas at San Antonio
Further affiant says that he has always
considered the information obtained
by him as to the location of said
Spring as reliable and authentic
as could be had - and never heard
the same questioned until he learned
of this controversy between El Paso ~~and~~

Reeves and Jeff Davis Counties last year.
Affiant further says that he and Mr.
C. W. Pressler, in compiling said map
used the utmost ~~deligence~~ care and
exhausted in his judgment every
reasonable means of obtaining in-
formation in order to make ^{said map} reliable.
