Dear Sir:-

By reason of re-survey of Blks. 3 and 4 T&P and the more recent re-survey of sections along the South line of Briscoe county the Commissioners Court has had the said line of the county re-established for ten miles west from the NE corner of Floyd county. The work has been done as indicated on the attached Plat, by G. A. Lider a Licensed State Land Surveyor of Texas, for the purpose of securing a correct rendition of the acreage of the county line sections herein reported and we are in hopes that with this information correction of the State Abstract books may be accomplished in time to correct the renditions on the 1932 tax rolls.

The Briscoe County Commissioners are interested in re-establishing the entire South boundary of the county and thus obtain a correct rendition of all county line sections but so far Floyd county has not seen fit to cooperate.

In the matter of county taxes collected for several years by adjoining county on land in Briscoe county, or vice a versa, do the statutes provide for a refund?
