Dear Sir:-

Your favor of May 2" informing me what is necessary to make field notes of value to your office and kindly permitting me to rise and explain if I can, is received. Aside from the two connections you mention, ~~what follows in my report.~~ If you will examine page 4 line 13 describing 8" mile on north line Gray County you will find the following words, intended to show a connection to land corners. " at 538 vrs. an iron pipe marked 89-90-107-108 B M 2 bears north 320 vrs. , same being N.W. corner of survey 89 in block M 2" From your letter it appears this connection is overlooked. This gives two connections in block M 2. If you will examine page 7 line 11 describing 31" mile on north line of Gray you will find the following words:-

" at 641 vrs. an iron pipe marked 169-192-194-214 B 3 & B 2, on ~~sea~~ south bank of creek, bears north 76 vrs. "

This pipe is the N.W. corner of survey # 169 block 3 and should be on record in your office. Since the N.W. corner of Gray is 30+1421, this pipe is 1421-641=780 vrs. east and 76 vrs. north from the N.W. of Gray County. I did know it would be necessary to make the estimate in this form. From what I have heard about arithmetic I believe this is right.

If you will examine line 22 on page 2 describing the 13" mile on Gray County west boundary, you will find the following words:-

" at 87 vrs. fence, whence an iron pipe marked 180-181 B 3 bears N. 89° 7' E. 819 vrs., pipe stands under fence, same being the S.E. corner of survey # 181 block 3 I & N R R. I can't think of any way to explain or make this plain. I intended it for a land connection on the west line of Gray County. ~~It was~~ told me the N.E. corner of 240 B 2 could be determined from this connection.

On page 4 line 9 you will find a connection to a pine peg and four pits which I took to be corner for a school file under act of 1900.

I find the connection to the S.E. corner of survey 58 block B 3 H & G N was overlooked in proof reading. The pipe is out at this corner but the post by it and the point where it stood was fully identified by witnesses, one being the land owner. From the S.W. corner of Gray County the S.E. corner of survey 58 block B 3 H & G N brs. S. 68° 8' E. 536 vrs. being south 200 vrs. and east 497 vrs. These are the connections which I told Mr. Hunnicutt that I had and I understood from him, they would be sufficient. I certify the above added connection is true and correct.

Please insert on page 1 field of boundaries between Gray and Carson in line 10 and after " bears S. 610 vrs." the following words :-  
( and an iron pipe marked 169-192-194-214-B 3 and B 2 on south bank of creek brs. E. 780 vrs. and N. 76 vrs. )
