Dear Sir:--- Please send me plain copy of field notes of the west line of Hemphill County, and let me know if the same is properly located; also the east and south lines of Gray County as surveyed by Husselby and Clark, ~~also~~ also a description of the south west corner of Roberts County, which Gray connected to in surveying Carson Co., and let me know how same was located.

I am on the ground to establish Gray County boundaries, formal notices having been given, and acting by authority of Roberts and Gray Counties, and with the full consent and acquiescence of Carson.

I will begin at the north west corner of Ochiltree and drop a meridian south to intersect ~~parallel~~ the parallel which Gray, Granger and myself extended west from the 42nd, mile post about the year 1890, and it is my intention to make the intersection of this parallel and meridian the s.w. corner of Gray County, and to make the west line of Ochiltree thirty miles plus 1629 feet and distribute any excess to the above mentioned parallel between Roberts and Gray. Please let me know if this construction is correct, if it will properly place the line as provided for by the statutes and if it harmonizes with the records of your office. I will appreciate all and any information which you may be able to add including blue prints of maps which may be in your office showing the boundaries which I have mentioned; also boundaries of Carson placed by Gray and s & e. boundaries of Gray County. My outfit is now ready and I will be on the ground before this letter reaches you, so please make the above cop

Replying to your letter of the 14th inst. in regard to boundary lines of Gray county I beg to say that plain copies of field notes of the line between Roberts and Hemphill counties, of the western line of Wheeler, and of the northern line of Donley will be sent you as soon as they may be made. Carson county lines were surveyed in March 1901 by Jas. L. Gray. He described its N.E. corner as follows; an iron pipe 2 inches diam. marked S.W.R, N.W.G, N.E.C, S.E.H from which a cedar north of bluff of East White Deer bears N. 2 W; hackberry on creek bears N. 23 3/4 W; lone tree in canon bears N. 53 3/4 E., round knoll N. 57 3/4 E. over



At its S.E. corner; 286 1/2 vis. N. and 362 vis E. of S.E. corner section 51 block B3, stone monument 2 1/2 ft. base, 5 1/2 ft. high, marked Carson, Gray, Donley Armstrong, from which Ed. Johnson's wind-mill is N.43 E.; M. James' wind-mill is S.50 1/4 W. about 2 1/3 miles.

I prefer not to express an opinion in regard to the construction of those lines until it shall be asked in accordance with article 606 revised statute of 1895- Besides I do not understand that any authority but a court can change the present established lines. Messrs Clark and Huselby in August 1903 surveyed the east and south lines of Gray, and collared at its N.E. corner for a conglomerate sand and gravel rock 12x14 15 inches high marked on four sides, the common corner of Gray, Humphill Roberts & Wheeler. Said rock is also the S.W. corner of sec. 13 block A2, H. & G. N. The S.E. corner is a square bisdare post marked on four sides, said post is 241 vis. N. and 213 1/2 E. of corner secs. 15, 16, 37, 38, block 23. 2-28-06 M. W. Smith
