



11 Field notes of the County line between
Rusk and Gregg Counties;

Beginning
at the South west corner of the George
Wetton Survey and the East line of Smith
County, due west from a stake 15 miles
North from the corner of the Court House
in the town of Henderson, Rusk County,
Texas, a stake from which a swivel gun
bears South 35° E. 8 feet marked R.C.
a swivel gun bears North 50° E. 39 feet,
marked G.C. an elm bears West 90 feet,
marked S.C. Then east with the South
line of the George Wetton Survey, the South
line of the J.W. Coleman Survey, also
east with the South line of the W.H.
Johnson Survey. Then east through
the W.P. Chisum Survey 3000 acres
North of the S-W corner of the same,
continuing east through the John S.
Cuthers Survey 460 acres North of
the South line of the same; then
east through the Mary Van Winkle
Survey 670 acres North of the South
line of the same. Then east through
the Henry Wells Survey 1210 acres North
of the North line of the same. Then east
through the H. Edwards Survey 964 acres

N. 10° E. from the South West corner of
the same, thence East striking the E.
Bradley Survey 1398 varas N. 10° E. from
the South East corner of the N. Edwards
Survey, and continuing East, striking
the west line of the H. Hoover Survey
150 varas N. 10° E. from the South West
corner of the same - thence East through
the H. Hoover Survey, striking the Frio
River Survey at half North west corner
of the J. W. Marcell Survey on the east
line of the H. Hoover Survey, thence East
through the Frio River Survey, striking
the John Mathew Survey 4560 varas
N. 10° E. from the South West corner of
the same - thence East through the
Mathew Survey, striking the J. Castro
Survey 5000 varas south of the Sabine

Sir:- Yours of the 1st inst; with field-notes of the south line of Gregg Co as run by the surveyors of Gregg and Rusk Counties has been received. I will state in reply that the field-notes are not satisfactory. There is no course or distance given from the S.E. corner of Gregg Co to two or more ~~xxxxxx~~ corners of the survey upon which the corner of the county is located. Also after passing the first four surveys on the line , there is no course or distance given from one or more of the corners of the surveys, through which the line passes, therefore the line cannot be applied or approved nor can accurate correction of the abstract be made until the above required data be furnished this Office.

Sir:- Yours of the 22nd ~~last~~ ult; with corrected field-notes of the C. F. Bergmann 160 acres school land purchase in Kendall Co has been received, and the correction filed and passed for examination. Section 1570 of the G. C. & S. F. R'y Co in Kendall Co is school land, and is not subject to settlement by pre-emption. The C. Ramirez pre-emption has not been patented, and I am not prepared at this time when it will be patented. If said pre-emption should be patented, the remainder of said section would not be subject to pre-emption or homestead, but would have to be purchased under the school land law.

Sir:- In reply to your favor of the 23rd ult; enclosing field-notes of the Southern boundary line of your county, I will state that the same cannot be accepted, as the law regulating the surveying of county boundary lines, has not been complied with. I respectfully refer you the act of April, 22, 1879 and the amendment of March, 8, 1885, and instead of giving distance from a line of a survey, the course and distance should be given to the county line from one or more corners of the surveys through which the county line passes, and especially from the Southern corners of the surveys that border on the Sabine as there is no data in this Office to definitely locate the river.
