In reply to your letter to me dated No. 22,1935 relative to some lands not abstracted in Hall County.

I have delayed replying on account of finding the stone monument at S.E.cornerof Hall County missing. Reports are that it was destroyed several years ago. I got the approximate location from nearby residents, but recently I secured a copy of T.L.Crews' field notes of west line of Childress County. I presume a copy is on file in your office. A study of these notes revealed to me that the east line of Hall County differed in variation from the survey lines of block 'H'

A.B. M. B.S. S. approximately 1 10'. Also that the S.E.cornerof

Hall County is 748 varas south and 280 varas west of the S.E. corner of sec. 106 said block 'H'. Having found the true location I ran west

454½ varas to the west line of the J.F.Coffee Survey. This made 60.2 acres in Hall County and balance in Childress County except a 17 vara strip down in Cottle County which is neglible.

Next, according to Surveyor Chipman's survey of section 16, J.Poitevent Blk.1 & putting 32.44 acres in Hall County, I find *** 52.34 acres of the C.H.Payne Pre-emption Survey located in Hall County.





Robt Turner Section 1, Wm Ring, S F 465 - 232.65 acres: All in Hall county, (Abst.1557) F 91755.


The affected assessors will be notified of above changes.


