All this the 20th day of March 1882 came on for consideration the report of the survey of the division line between the Counties of Hill and McKinnan made by W. M. Vaughan Surveyor of Hill County and J. S. Pratt Surveyor for McKinnan County in pursuance of a former order of this Court said report after due consideration of the Court is approved and it is ordered that the same together with the plat and field notes accompanying be placed of record upon the minutes of this Court and that the Clerk of this Court furnish the Commissioner of the General Land office of the State of Texas with a certified copy of the same. Said report is as follows

To the County Court of Hill County Texas
We beg leave to submit to your honorable Court the following as a report of a survey made under orders issued out this on the day of 2nd of 1888 appointing; and acting in concert with a like special surveyor delecting me as special surveyor appointed by the County Court of McKinnan County to locate and define the boundary line between the Counties of Hill and McKinnan of afore said State.

In pursuance of an in obedience to
instruction contained in aforesaid order
at 12 m on February 1st 1882 there being
present W M Vaughan assisted by
C Teal surveyors appointed to represent
Hill County and J P Durath assisted by S M
Jannerson surveyors appointed to repre-
sent McKinnon County we entered upon
the work aforesaid taking the ^{center of the} public
square in the city of Tracy for our start-
ing point from which to measure a base
line up the Brazos river the distance of
15 miles as per directions in aforesaid
order from this Court and by a careful
Coursing & measurement of said dis-
tance at both from said starting
point we ascertained that a point 15 miles dis-
tant would be about 680 or so below the
mouth or upper line of the Lemuel Rice
League survey and 187 1/2 Varas below
the point on the Brazos river selected
by Teal and Jannerson surveyors
acting under order issued out of the
Commissions Court during the year
1880 for the beginning point of the line
selected and marked out by them at that
time We would here state that Coursing
from Tracy North Westerly with the
general course of the river would not
would not reach as far up the river
by a hundred or more Varas as the
