

According to the laws creating the Counties of Collin and Hunt, no conflict can exist between the two Counties, as both were created in April 1846 and both based upon the same line.

Hunt Co. begins at the S. W. corner of Lamar Co (which lies on the E. line of Fannin 30 miles S. of its S. E. corner, the E. line of Fannin being 60 miles long) thence S. $33\frac{1}{2}$ miles, thence W. 25 miles, thence North to the S. E. corner of Collin Co. and with its East line to the S. line of Fannin Co.

Collin Co. begins 25 miles West of the S. E. corner of Fannin Co. therefore a conflict is impossible according to the reading of the law.

The fieldnotes of County lines of Hunt Co. by McQuincy H. Wright of date Novemb. 20/46 and filed in this Office in 1851 begin at the S. E. corner of old Fannin Land District thence South $8\frac{1}{2}$ miles thence West 25 miles thence North to the South line of Fannin County.

Geo White's fieldnotes of Collin Co. call to begin at the 25th milepost in the South boundary of Fannin Land District as run by Orr in 1850.

The statement of Henry Y. Kincy shows that the S. E. corner of Collin Co. as established by White in 1850 lies 520 m East of the West line of Hunt Co. established by Wright.

The trouble arises from the fact, that three different lines have been run, but Orr's line ^{has} been accepted as the correct one and the S. E. corner of Collin Co. was based upon it. The lines run by Wright being of prior date than Orr's line have been based on either Brook's or Cochran's S. E. corner of Fannin Land District. There are no fieldnotes on file of any of these lines.

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
