The survey made by Mr. H. Wright in 1846 was under the authority of the act of May 12<sup>th</sup> 1846. There was no County on the South of Hunt at that time, and thus could not be any notice to an adjoining County.

This survey was conclusive.

If it be contended that a survey by one County surveyor under such circumstances, is not so sacred as a joint survey, then certainly, the survey made by the Kaufman surveyor two years later was equally equivalent to a joint survey and gave it all the sacredness of a joint survey, and the line then run and marked must be regarded as the true line, and
