REPORT OF SURVEY NORTH BOUNDARY HUTCHINSON COUNTY, TEXAS.

STATE OF TEXAS, COUNTY OF HUTCHINSON.

TO THE HONORABLE COUNTY COURT OF HUTCHINS ON COUNTY:

In compliance with your Order to establish and mark the North Boundary of Hutchinson County, I, T. O. James, a licensed State Land Surveyor, was at the Southwest corner Hansford County at 1 o'clock P. M. Dec. 5th, 1928, that being the place and time designated in your Order.

I there met Mr. R. G. Armstrong, representing your County. D. B. Stribling, of Roberts County, was also present. Mr. Armstrong and I not agreeing as to the correctness of this corner, as already established, for the common corner of Hutchinson, Hansford, Moore and Sherman Counties, we refe<u>red</u> the matter to the Commissioner of the General Land Office by a night-letter. The Comr. requested a detailed statement of our disagreement, signed by each of us.

I could not find Mr. Armstrong to prepare and file such statement, but very soon thereafter he filed with your Court a report purporting to be a survey of the 4 corners of Hutchinson County, accepting the 2 North corners as correct.

On March 2nd, 1929, it was agreed between Officials of Hutchinson and Hansford Counties that I proceed, alone, to establish and mark the Boundary in compliance with said Order, allotting the acreage in each section, crossed by said boundary, to the proper county.

Beginning on the 14th day of March, I therefore ran a preliminary line from the recognized Southwest corner of Hansford County Eastward 30 miles to a concrete cone set by W. D. Twichell in 1907 for the Northwest corner of Roberts County and found the cone to be in excess of 30 miles.

To determine more accurately its proper location I awaited the survey of the Boundary of Ochiltree and Hansford Counties, the same having been ordered by the County Courts of said Counties.

In this survey, assisted by Allen of Ochiltree County and Stribling of Roberts County, from the Northeast corner of Hansford County, in the North line of the State of Texas, the same being a rock marked O 30 on east side and H on west, we ran a true Meridian South, with two

sets of chain carriers, and found this cement cone to be 30 miles 1311.5 varas. As this was a greater excess than we deemed correct, it was agreed that we measure the East line of Lipscomb County for comparison. This I did, Aug. 14th, to 19th, with one set of chain-carriers, and found the said line to be 30 miles 1271.1 vrs.

Reporting said finding to the above named surveyors, we met the 29th day of Aug. and made a new, reinforce concrete pillar for the correct corner of Hutchinson, Hansford, Ochiltree and Roberts Counties. 40.4 varas North of the one existing.

Following the establishment of the Southeast corner of Hansford County, Northeast corner of Hutchinson County, I proceeded to make the survey, the accompanying fieldnotes of which are a full description.
