The undersigned, T. D. Jones,  
respectfully represents that, under  
the provisions of An Act of the Legislature  
of the State of Texas, approved April  
22, 1879, Chapter 129 page 137 Acts of 1879.  
He was duly appointed by the  
Commissioners Court of Jack County  
as will appear by "Exhibit A" hereto  
attached and R. W. Watkins was  
appointed by the Commissioners  
Court of Clay County, as ~~Surveyor~~  
will appear by Exhibit B. hereto  
attached, as Surveyors for their  
respective Counties, to Survey and  
Establish the South Boundary Line  
of Clay County which is the North  
Boundary line of Jack County,  
Texas, on the 25th of August 1890.

That in pursuance of said above  
mentioned orders said Watkins and  
the undersigned met on the 25 Aug  
1890 and after a conference found  
that they could not agree upon the  
line to be run; or as to the legal and  
proper mode of ascertaining the true boundary  
line between said Counties. The undersigned  
proposed to survey the line heretofore legally  
established by Samuel Green, a surveyor  
appointed by the Commissioners Court of  
Clay County, and Wesley Galloway, a surveyor  
appointed by the Commissioners Court of Jack  
County for that purpose, as will appear by  
Exhibits C. D. & E. hereto attached; and to

remark the same by suitable monuments where necessary.  
But said R.W. Watkins refused to run said line and  
insisted that the line should be run without reference  
to said Calloway & Green's survey as follows; Beginning  
at a point 4 miles due west of the S.W. corner of Wise  
County as now established thence due west, with  
the true variation, to the E.B. line of Archer or N.W.  
Corner of Jack County. While claiming that he could  
and would recognize no other line than that established  
by said Green and Calloway, the undersigned further  
insisted that, inasmuch as Clay County called for  
and recognized the North line of Jack County, that  
it was clearly the intention of the Legislature that  
the E.B. line of Jack County should be surveyed and  
that the S.E. of ~~Young~~<sup>Clay</sup> County should be determined  
thereby and that Jack County's E.B. line should be  
determined as follows; Beginning at the S.W. corner  
of Wise County as originally established, Thence  
West to the E.B. line of Young County, Thence  
North 30 miles with said E.B. line of Young County  
Thence East to N.W. corner of Wise County, or to  
its W.B. line or an extension of same, and  
that the variation to be used should  
be determined from and should be  
the same as that upon which said  
West Boundary line of Wise County  
was originally run and should not  
be the true variation unless said line was  
originally run upon that variation.

It appears that  
there are two North West  
Corners claimed by for Wise  
County. one made by the  
original or first survey  
of the lines of said county,

of L. S. Camp in 1856, and one of  
later date claimed by Montague and  
denied by Wise County; and,  
probably, settled in favor of Montague  
County (as I am informed) because  
Wise did not have a surveyor  
present at the time said south line  
of Montague County was run. Mr.  
Watkins and myself agreed to  
submit for your ~~Honor~~ decision under  
said Act of 1879, each separately,  
the points of disagreement as  
follows;

1st. Is<sup>or</sup> not the line between Clay  
and Jack Counties already fixed  
and established by the said above  
described survey, made by Samuel  
Green and Wesley Calloway as  
aforesaid and should not said  
Boundary ~~line between Clay & Jack counties~~  
~~line be reed by the field notes~~  
of said survey?

2nd. If said survey by Calloway  
and Green has not established  
said line, should not said line be  
established by beginning at the  
S.W. corner of Wise County, Thence  
West to E. B. line of Young County  
Thence North with said line 30 miles  
Thence East to <sup>W. B.</sup> ~~the~~ line of Wise County  
or an extension of the same; using such  
a variation of the needle as will  
set Jack County square <sup>at right angles</sup> off from  
said W. B. line of Wise County.

3rd. Whether the variation to be used

in running said North line should be the true variation or whether said variation should be determined from lines run on the ground (of Wise or Jack Counties) and, if so, what lines; provided said Calloway and Green line surveyed as aforesaid is not the true boundary?

4th. At How shall the N.W. or S.W. corner of Wise County, as a beginning point for the North line of Jack County, be located? Shall the corners of Wise Co as originally surveyed, or as recently run, be regarded as the true beginning point from which to survey said boundary of Clay & Jack Counties?

5th. Are these county lines to be surveyed as lines of Platting or office surveys, whose calls are to be found in the Statutes; or as lines of surveys made on the ground whose field notes have been returned to the General Land Office.

I submit that, under the statute, that after Clay and Jack Counties had duly and legally appointed Surveyors for that purpose, and the Surveyors so appointed had met and agreed on and established the line between said counties, that said line became then and there the true line between said counties.

and could not thereafter be changed except by the Legislature. And the assent or dissent of the Commissioners Court of Clay County, thereafter, could have no bearing or effect, whatever, on said line to change or invalidate it. The Statute does not require any action on the part of said Court, after survey to validate or legalize said line so established. Where one surveyor, on the failure of the other to attend, makes the survey, the Statute provides for the approval of the Commissioners Court.

These Counties must either be regarded as office or platted surveys or as surveys made on the ground. If platted surveys, they should be governed, as to variation of fiddle &c, by <sup>lines of</sup> the older counties which they adjoin, unless the Statute specially directs, as it does in some County boundaries, that the line shall be run due North, West &c. The general direction of the Statute is that surveys be made square, and this cannot be done, unless a regard is had to the true course of line which such survey adjoins. In defining the North boundary line of Archer County, the Statute directs that it ~~run due south East~~; but it directs

that the North line of Jack County  
run east to North West corner of Wise  
County; leaving out the word due; an  
omission very significant of  
the true intention of the Legislature  
as to the course of said line.

If these counties are to be treated  
as surveys made on the ground, then  
the original lines, or first lines run,  
are the true lines and surveyors now  
can do no more than to find and  
re-mark those old lines.

And, in this connection, I submit  
that the corners of Wise county, having  
been marked on the ground, and the  
lines of Jack County having been  
surveyed from those corners, a  
change, subsequently, in the corners  
of Wise County, does not and ought  
not to work a change in the lines  
of Jack County. I respectfully  
request that your <sup>Honor</sup> procure from the  
proper authorities of Wise County an  
official statement of all surveys  
that have been made of the N.W.  
& S.W. corners and W.B. line of Wise  
County, and the circumstances  
attending such survey, which are  
not now on file in your office,  
and that your <sup>Honor</sup> ascertain authoritatively  
whether or not the Commissioners  
Court of Clay County did duly  
approve of said survey made by  
Calloway and Green; or that your

Honor grant me an opportunity  
to present to you an official statement  
from the proper authorities, of the  
facts concerning these matters  
before you render your decision.

I request this because I have  
barely time under ~~now~~ the agreement  
insisted upon by Mr. Watkins to  
get this statement before you.

Be it remembered that on this day came on to be considered the question of the North boundary line of Jack County. And it appearing to the satisfaction of the Commissioners Court of Jack County, the Commissioners Court of Clay County did on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of June 1890 pass an order of said Court which is recorded in the minutes of said Court in Vol No 3 page 293 which orders one R.W. Watkins a practical surveyor be appointed in behalf of Clay Co, to ascertain by actual survey the South boundary line of Clay County which is the North boundary line of Jack County. And whereas a Copy of said order was served upon said Commissioners Court of Jack County on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of Aug. 1890 the date of the convening of this term of the Commissioners Court of Jack County. And whereas said order of said Court requires the said R.W. Watkins to commence said survey of said line on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of August 1890. It is therefore ordered adjudged decreed and Considered by this Commissioners Court that this Court does here enter its solemn protest against the said Contemplated survey of the South boundary line of Clay County. (which is the North boundary line of Jack County) for the reasons. 1<sup>st</sup> That here before to w<sup>t</sup> on the day of May 1876, The Commissioners Court of Jack County entered an order which is recorded in the minutes of said Court in book B<sup>3</sup> page 130 appointing W. Callaway. a practical & Competent surveyor in behalf of Jack Co, to ascertain by actual survey the North boundary line of Jack Co, and a Certified Copy of said order was duly served

on the Commissioners Court of Clay County. And whereas it further appearing to the Court that in pursuance of said last named order the said W. Callaway on behalf of Jack County and one Samuel Gruen a practical & competent surveyor Appointed by and on behalf of Clay County did Jointly on the 8<sup>th</sup> 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup> days of June 1876 by an actual survey & the placing of Mile stones & posts establish the true North boundary line of Jack County and the south boundary line of Clay County as shown by their said report which is signed by the said Samuel Gruen surveyor of Clay County and by the said W. Callaway surveyor of Jack County and is recorded in the Minutes of the Commissioners Court in book B<sup>3</sup> page 147 & 148 by which said joint survey the North boundary line of Jack County and the South boundary line of Clay County was duly established which said report was duly received and confirmed by the Commissioners Court of Jack County. I<sup>nd</sup> That in the said order of said Comrs Court of Clay County they require the said R. W. Watkins to begin said sur at the south East corner of Clay Co, the same being the south west cor of Montague County and run from thence West to the south West corner of said Clay County while said order should command the said R. W. Watkins to establish said South boundary line of Clay County by first establishing the North boundary line of Jack County And that the north boundary line of Jack County should be established by begining at the south west corner of wise County

running thence west to the East boundary line  
of Young County. Thence North with the East  
boundary line of Young County thirty miles. Thence  
East to the North West Cor of Wise County.

It is further ordered by the Court that T.D. Jones, a  
practical & competent surveyor appointed on behalf  
of Jack County who is now the duly elected qualified  
& acting County surveyor of Jack County shall meet  
the said R.W. Watkins on the said 25<sup>th</sup> of August  
1890 at the place mentioned in said order to assist  
in running surveying and establishing of said  
South boundary line of Clay County Texas which is  
the North boundary line of Jack County.

It is further ordered by the Court that a Certified  
Copy of this order be mailed at once by register  
mail to the County Judge of Clay County Texas  
as presiding officer of the Commissioners Court of  
said Clay Co., Texar, and that a Certified Copy of  
this order be served on the said T.D. Jones County  
surveyor

This day came on to be heard and considered the order of County Commissioners Court of Clay County, Texas, (No. 36,) ordering C. B. Patterson County Surveyor of Clay County to proceed and ascertain survey and mark the dividing line between the Counties of Clay and Jack on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of September 1884 which said order is as follows:

Order 36

It appearing to the satisfaction of this Court that the dividing line between Clay County and Jack County is not sufficiently specified It is hereby ordered that C B. Patterson County Surveyor of Clay County be appointed to proceed and ascertain survey and mark such line. Beginning at the S.W. corner of Montague County and South East corner of Clay County and it is hereby ordered that the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of September 1884 be the time set for surveying said line, and it is further ordered that the County Clerk of Clay County cause a certified copy of this order to be presented to the Commissioners of Jack County at least ten days before the time set for surveying said line.

And it appearing to the Court that heretofore to wit on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of April 1876 the Hon County Commissioners Court of Clay County, Texas, made an order appointing Sam Green County Surveyor of Clay County to run the dividing line between Clay and Jack Counties commencing at the South East corner of Clay County and the North East corner of Jack County. And it further appearing that the Hon County Commissioners Court of

Jack County, Texas, in pursuance of their notification of order did on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of May 1876 appointed W Callaway Surveyor of Jack County Texas to meet said Sam Green at the time and place named in said order to assist in running and establishing the line between said Counties of Clay and Jack.

And it further appearing that said Sam Green Co Surveyor of Clay County and the said W Callaway Co Surveyor of Jack County did in pursuance of the orders of their respective County Commissioners Courts and according to the Statute in such cases made and provided proceed to survey mark designate and establish said line between Clay and Jack Counties which work was done on the 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> days of June A.D., 1876 and the report and field notes thereof signed by both said Sam Green and W Callaway and filed in the County Clerks office of Jack County on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of November 1876 and properly recorded on the minutes of said Co Comrs, Court (Mkd) Journal pages 147 and 148. It is therefore ordered by the Court that J M Hughes County surveyor of Jack County, Texas do on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of September A.D., 1884. Meet C.B. Patterson County surveyor of Clay County at South East corner of said County and assist him in running the dividing line between the Counties of Clay and Jack and it is further ordered that he run the line established by said Sam Green County Surveyor of Clay County and said W Callaway County Surveyor of Jack County as the same is described in their report of the same to their respective County Courts.
