


Extract of "an act, defining the boundaries of the County of Jackson."

Section 1st. Be it enacted &c.

That from and immediately after the passage of this act, the following shall be the lines of the County of Jackson, to wit, Commencing on the Bay at a place called the divide between the Trespalacios and Canancahue creeks, running thence North 29° East to a corner, thence North 12° East to the line of Colorado County, thence South 82° West to the mouth of Smith's Creek on the Lavaca, thence down the Lavaca (to the Lower corner of Kent's League of Land, thence six miles with the line of Gonzales County, from thence a direct line to the Bay at the mouth of the ) thence with the middle of the Bay to a point opposite the beginning.
