Sir

Under Section 8th of
an "Act" prescribing the manner of ascertaining
the boundaries of Counties - Act of 1879 Chapter
129 page 137.

I have the honor to submit to your
consideration the following statement to wit:

By an order of the Commissioners Court of
Kenosha County Lines issued on the Day of
May 1883 Commanding of me to Survey &
mark and place post and monuments on the
boundary line between the Counties of Kenosha and
De Witt which said boundary line was surveyed and
marked as appears from the records of De Witt
County in the year 1854 by J. R. Hamilton
(who is now a resident of De Witt County) representing
De Witt County and C. A. Russell Commissioner &
Surveyor for Kenosha County Copy of field notes
of which Survey we herin Enclose.

We proceeded to the place appointed by the
Commissioners Court of Kenosha County at the
line appointed for the beginning of the Survey which
place was at the point where the S.W. line of the
Dr. Gonzales intersected the N.W. Boundary line of De
Witt County. I there met Mr. C. G. Weston Surveyor
appointed by the Commissioners Court of De Witt
County to Survey the ^{Co.} lines in question we found
upon the beginning point - and run the N.W. line of
De Witt County which is the S.E. line of Kenosha County
finding the line well marked - We measured this line to a

distance of 19200 ft. or 10 miles E. & 200 ft. S. and from my knowledge of the County the point where the N.W. corner of DeWitt County should be we ceased to run this line any farther and began the search for the N.W. corner of DeWitt County. I then proceeded to the point where the S.E. or E. line of a preemption made for W. H. H. Davis for 160 acres cuts across the boundary line of Kearny and DeWitt Counties this surveying having been made by C. A. Russell the year after he (Russell) had surveyed the Co. line. It seemed very reasonable to me that this would be a satisfactory as well as a fixed point for said County Boundary as the bearings and lines of said Davis Survey still exist - the Call of the Davis Survey is as follows from the N.W. corner south at 45° 0' N. crosses DeWitt and Kearny County line Course N 39° W. We measured this distance from the north Cor. of the Davis Survey and then took the course of the County line N 39° W. and at about six or seven hundred ft. we found a line marked similarly to Co lines (I.C.) with 4 Hocks and a L.O. on the East of the line was marked with a D and a Live Oak on the west side marked K. I continued this line with the compass without changing at about 2000 ft. I found the corner claimed by L.G. Norman ex Co. Surveyor of this County (Kane) laid by him to be made upon the S.E. line of DeWitt County which Mr. Norman made in dividing the W.C. Bullock Survey. I continued this line N 39° W. finding it marked very old 4 Hocks and one other Live Oak standing on the S.E. side of line marked K. I found this line ploughed to within I suppose about 5 or 6 hundred ft. of

The N.W. boundary of DeWitt Co. when the marks
gave out. I continued the line to the intersection of the
line we had run from the F. Gonzales Survey intersecting
said line some six or seven hundred to
85° W of the 19200 on Stake we had previously
placed I then searched for the corner called for
in the field notes made by said L & A Russell & J. R.
Hamilton Aug. 1868 and failed to find the
same. There are two line posts one D and
the other D & K & or. X standing N39°W of the N.W.
Boundary of DeWitt Co. 210.0 and 45.8 of the line
that I run from the Davis Survey. 108.0
This not being sufficient evidence to convince
The Surveyor of DeWitt Co. Mr. C. G. Hartman that this
was the original boundary line he claiming that
DeWitt Co. should run a given distance from
the Guadalupe River and that it required further
measurement to obtain this distance - we then
met with the S.E. line of the County trying to find the
beginning cor of Karnes County and the S.W. cor.
of DeWitt Co. there having been a settlement
made near this corner I am satisfied the
beginnings to the cor have been destroyed as we
searched for a mile around and could not
find any evidence of the same. I then returned
to this point before mentioned on the Davis Survey
and ran a trial line S.89°E finding two other
trees marked in a distance of 2000 m. in nearly that
distance I chained this line from Mustang
Creek which is about 75 m. from this point of
beginning on the Davis Survey after passing the marks
before mentioned I now found any other marks
natural or artificial or called for in the Survey
made by Russell & Hamilton Mr. C. G. Hartman

Dissenting from this line being established from
the evidence that I have related before I then
agreed to go to the corner of DeWitt County as es-
tablished by J. H. Smith & J. A. Barnard in the year
1848 which corner is said to be plainly marked
being a mound in which a Battle was buried and
discovered - marked for bearings &c. which we believe
could be established and which was the point of
beginning when the present Boundary line of Kanes
and DeWitt was made by said Russell & Hamillar
But the said C. S. Hartman Surveyor would
not consent under any circumstances to
beginning the Survey at said point - claiming
DeWitt Co. was in sum a certain number of miles
from the Guadalupe River on the N.W. B. side
of the County of DeWitt irrespective of Kanes
Claims or of any survey heretofore
made annihilating all other surveys made heretofore
we claim that if the boundary as established
by the Surveyors C. S. Russell & J. R. Hamillar in the
year 1854 and which Survey was approved by the Courts of
both Counties and placed upon the County maps and rec-
ognized by both Counties for 29 years can not still
remain as the legal Boundary of DeWitt & Kanes that does
certainly can be no more proper way of fixing this line only by
Surveying the same as it was formerly said to have been Surveyed be-
ginning at the S.W. cor. of DeWitt Co. as it originally was and running
N 18° 50' W. and then NW as is the wording of its Statute in
fixing the boundary of Kanes Co. hoping to receive your
consideration & anxiety day I remain yours

Beginning at the most southerly Cor. of DeWitt County
as made by J. N. Smith of DeWitt and J. H. Barnard of
Galilee where No. 1 E. 5000 is west th line of DeWitt
and Galilee Counties h- open ground from which
a Lime Oak 28 inches in diameter bears S 60° E. 4 or
and K + P D another L.O. and G. 24 in dia br. &
10 E. 9 or. and another 12 in dia and D br. 842 E.
24 m. another 10 in dia and K br. 885 W. 18 or.
then (N 39° E.) (crossed the cross roads) at 2613
m. crossed Branch. Course South at 35874. a L.O.
30 in dia and K at 4771 m. Branch. Course East
at 11,351 crossed the Coopers Creek Course East
at 13,461 m. at Hulley's south. a Hulley D K at
16,411 m. a Branch of the Coopers Creek Course
South at 19,023 crosses road from Holton
to Yorktown at 20,825 m. crosses the road from
Mayfield to Yorktown at 21,755 m. a L.O.
and Head of Salt Branch ^{Creek} and DK at 27,812 m.
Crossed the Head branch of running into the dry
fork of the Elkhorn Muskingum Creek at 30,948 m. crosses
Muskingum Creek, a meander and D + K at 3284^m
a Crossed branch course S. observed from Holton to York
town except N.W. of road and K and a L.O. S.E. of road
and D at 35,821 m. made the Cor. of DeWitt & Seneca
Counties and a road and a post on it from which
a L.O. 16 inches. dia. br. 8692 E. 34 or. and D at
this point. we intersected the North Westly Boundary
