As feeling a spe-
cial interest in the matter I beg leave to
state in addition to Surveyor Hale's report that
the case is a very simple one. When by the act
of the legislature of 1848, the line was alloted
between Duvall & Goldie Cos, the Com^{ee}s of
the two counties in the manner provided by law
appointed surveyors to run the new line, com-
mencing on the old Graveline County - du-1st line
on the corner on the Collector's and to establish
the S W corner of Duvall & Goldie Cos. This was
done & their reports approved by the Com^{ee}'s
of the two Counties. This corner of Goldie
& Duvall Cos is well defined in the reports
& both were run with manuscript
of the boundaries from the Sec of State and the
names of the County Com^{ee}s and the date of
the survey with four bearings to different
points with a around with a sketch placed upon
it as one of them so that this corner can be
readily found and is a most convenient re-
cipient of beginning. It was the point of
beginning in 1854 when the boundary was run
between Duvall & Klickitat. To ignore that point now
as a place of beginning would be to condemn
the surveyors who with so much care
established it 1848. One of whom Dr Barnes, had

no superior in the State as a surveyor.

Why then go back to begin on the other side
of the Guadalupe river and run a long line
at a heavy expense, as I understand Duvall Co-
ordinates. It would be a good job for a surveyor
but no advantage, that - I can run to my own
line -
