Dear Sir;- When instructions in regard to the establishment of the County lines of Kent County, were forwarded Jan, 29th ult, it was not known that the County lines of said county had been run, but were rejected by this Office, and that on Jan, 11, 1895, you had been notified of the objection, and also referring to the laws governing the establishment of County Boundaries. Since it has been found that, the County lines of Dickens County, had been established and approved by this Office, March, 3, 1892, also those of Fisher County, Oct, 24, 1887, the S. E. and S. W. corner and South line of Dickens should be adopted for the N. E. and N. W. corner and North line of Kent County. Also the North line of Fisher County, and its continuation West for the South line of Kent County, and the East and West line of Kent County should be run from the S. E. and S. W. corner of Dickens County due South to the North line of Fisher and Scurry County, irrespective of the length of the line.
