Dear Sir:

On July 25th 1894 the Hon. W. L. McLaughy Comr Soil Land office, by his letter of that date adopted as the true boundary line between Lampasas and Burnet Counties, the line as run by E. Brown in June 1892, and states that the abstracts had been ordered to be changed to conform to said line, subsequently it seems that the printing of the corrections in said abstracts was suspended until the Land office was notified of the action to be taken at the Sept. term 1894 of the Commissioners Court of Burnet County regarding said line.

In Sept. or Oct. 1894 the Comr. Court of Burnet County appointed E. J. Moses Co Surveyor of Burnet County to go upon the ground, and make search for the line alleged to have been run by John Harvey, in 1853. Having been notified of this action taken on the part of Burnet County the Comr. Court of Lampasas County appointed V. N. Gively County

Brown, having been established in accordance with law, and approved by the Court of the Soil Land Office, that the abstracts should be changed at once to conform to the same.
