The State of Texas  
Counties of Live Oak & Nueces

Field notes of Survey of the South boundary of Live Oak County and North boundary of Nueces County, from the N. E. corner of Dimmit County, to the Nueces River, made in accordance with an order of the Commissioners Court of Nueces County and concurrent action of the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, by the respective Surveyors of said Counties, and under the order and instructions, of the respective Commissioners Courts of said Counties.

Beginning at a Stone Monument about  $3\frac{1}{2}$  ft. in diameter, and  $5\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, the N. East corner of Dimmit County.

Thence due East, with a variation of the Needle of  $9^{\circ}30' E$ , at 472 rods crossed Llano Blanco Creek, a branch of Lagarto Creek running South, at 4542 rods crossed Road from Oakville to San Diego, at 4292. Was a Mesquite live tree marked  $\equiv$  on the East and West side, at 5042 rods set a post marked 9 on the North side and 3 on the South side from which the North corner of a Homestead Survey No. 34 made for Francisco Charles Bear

N.  $31\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W. 60 varas, at 6462 varas crossed  
the West fence of R. H. Corbet's pasture, at  
6800 varas passed 50 $\frac{1}{2}$  North of R. H.  
Corbet's tank and mill, at 7219 varas  
crossed the East line of said Corbet's  
pasture fence, at 86 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas crossed  
Kentuck Creek running South, at 948 $\frac{1}{2}$   
varas to a lone Mosquili tree marked  $\equiv$   
on the East and West sides, at 1044 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas  
set a post marked 12 on the North side  
and 6 on the South side, from which  
a Mosquili tree marked  $\overline{\equiv}$  bears N.  $19\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$   
W. 91 varas, at 13516 varas passed 860  
varas North of the home of Henderson  
Williams (deceased) on his Rancho on the  
South bank of Lagarto Creek, at 13540  
Simon Smithwick's home bears N.  $44\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$   
E. At 1504 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas crossed Lagarto Creek  
25 varas wide running N. E. by E., at  
1644 $\frac{1}{2}$  varas set a post marked 15  
on the North side and 9 on the  
South side said post on the Northern  
slope of a limestone hill from which  
Simon Smithwick's home bears N.  $16\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W.  
and J. C. Lathams house bears N.  $68\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$  E.  
At 19664 varas, crossed a branch of  
Lagarto creek running North. At 21600  
varas passed 495 varas North of the  
South corner of a Survey of  $\frac{2}{3}$  League for

Mr. Brown. At 22142 varas a post set on  
the West side of a branch marked 18  
on the North side, and 12 on the South  
side, from which a Mesquiti standing  
on the South side of said branch and  
marked ~~X~~ bears South 52 varas. At  
22162 crossed said branch running  
North. At 24842 varas set a post  
in open prairie marked 21 on the North  
side and 15 on the South side, at  
29082 varas, crossed Oakville and Cor-  
pus Christi road runs S. 14° E. At 29992  
varas Russell house bears S. 63½° E. At  
31662 varas said house bears S. 31¾° E. At  
32542 varas crossed the old road from  
Oakville to Corpus Christi. At 33542 varas  
set a post marked 24 on the North side  
and 18 on the South side from which a  
Mesquiti tree marked ~~X~~ bears N. 42° W. 77  
varas. At 36482 varas ruins of Casa Blanca  
bear S. 39½° E. At 37542 varas same bear  
S. 2½° W. At 39222 varas the centre of  
Penitas Creek 40 varas wide. At 39242  
varas a large Elm tree on the East Bank  
of Penitas Creek 24 inches diameter marked  
24 on the North side and 21 on the  
South side. At 39348 varas crossed a  
3 plank fence of  
posture. At 30044 varas set a pointed

mosquili post on the West bank of the Nueces River from which three oak trees marked  
X<sup>3</sup> bear respectively West  $1\frac{3}{4}$  ranges S 22° W  $1\frac{3}{4}$  ranges, S 52 E.  $1\frac{1}{4}$  ranges, said post is set on the West bank of the river about one half mile below the junction of Penitas creek with the Nueces River and being set for the South East corner of Live Oak County, and N. E. corner of Nueces County.
