Dear Sir:

This is in answer to yours of the 10th instant in regard to the Lynn-Garza County boundary and calling attention to a report or statement made to this office by surveyors Sylvan Sanders and W. D. Twishell, October 23rd, 1926 to which Mr. Sanders advises that they have had no reply. The statement referred to was received in this office October 26, 1926. This report does not seem to call for a reply, so it was filed away without answer.

The instructions given by this department February 18, 1926 to run a line 30 miles east from the S. W. corner of Lubbock County for the purpose of fixing the N. E. corner of Lynn County it was the intention that this line should follow the south boundary of Lubbock County as established by J. B. Jones. At that time there was nothing on file here to show whether the south line of Lubbock County would measure out correct in distance or be found long or short. For that reason the north line of Lynn County was limited to the statutory call for 30 miles.

The line and connections reported by Messrs. Sanders and Twichell show a difference or shortage of only 4.6 varas in the length of the Lubbock County line. This difference in measurement when compared with the length of line, ~~30~~ 30 miles, seems too insignificant to take notice of, in consideration of which it would seem reasonable and proper to accept said S. E. corner of Lubbock County for the N. E. corner of Lynn County.
