

Field notes of the Resurvey of the McLemore County  
line concluded May 1868 by V. H. McLemore  
County Surveyor of McLemore Co

Beginning on the west bank of the Dryas river  
15 miles above Waco as established by prior

Survey and as directed by law with point  
is also S 30° E, 1638 varas and N 60° E 860 varas  
from the S. E. corner of the Miguel Rabago  
grant and make a corner on an ash tree marked  
M C O line and run from thence S 60° W  
putting up at cedar post at every mile  
and rock mounds at all roades

at 1550 varas entered prairie  
at 3 miles 1660 varas crossed Childers creek

6 miles 1500 varas to the Waco & Clifton road  
10 miles 780 varas the east line of the John McLemore

Survey 700 varas N 30° W from the S. E. corner  
of

From where the north line leaves the river N. B. & E. 13  
 miles the Survey of 960 acres in the name of E.

 John Oliver 800 acres from the north East corner  
 of the same  
 15 miles 400 acres east line of B. C. Carter  
 400 from the S. E. corner N. E. L. Leman
