Dear Sir:

Facts have come to my knowledge, in regard to the running of the East line of Schleicher County and the west line of Menard, - which are such, that I have no doubt, but what said surveys are erroneous and in every way incorrect, not corresponding in any particular with the survey heretofore made <sup>by</sup> Mr. A. E. Schuchard, the Surveyors having made no connections with any surveys along the line and having run on the wrong variation, and I claim they have made the S. W. cor. of Menard Co. both to far east and north of the cor. heretofore established by Mr. Schuchard. In fact the Surveyors of Sutton and Kinble Counties, have established no line at all, for they have placed no monuments to mark the line that they claim to have run, and all they claim to have done, is to commence at the north west cor. of Menard Co., and run

south 26 miles, establishing the S.W. cor of Menard, the N.W. cor of Kumble and the N.E. cor of Sutton Counties all of which work I claim to be incorrect and do most earnestly protest against the approval of the same by the General Land Office.

The Commissioners Court of Menard Co. proposes to re-run this line (the west line of Menard Co) in conjunction with the Surveyors of Kumble & Sutton Counties, so there may be no further trouble about this matter and in fact Geo. McKieal nor W. P. Hope or the Surveyor of any other County has the legal right, to establish the S.W. Cor. or west line of Menard Co. without the consent of the Commissioners Court of said county. Should the Land Office see fit to approve the report of McKieal and Hope over this protest, we will endeavor to sustain our rights in the Courts.
