I will say that our Commissioners Court ordered the Survey made and a certified copy of the order was forwarded to the County Judge of Williamson County. At the appointed time Mr Howlett with the Surveyor of said County, and after a day or so work they failed to agree and Mr H says the Williamson Co Surveyor left him without notifying him Howlett - When he Howlett proceeded to make the Survey made his report which was approved by our Commissioners Court and a copy forwarded to you & also to the Conn Court of Williamson Co - Since a report has been received of the Survey of the Williamson Co Surveyor

Sr. Sir:-

In reference to the county line between Milam  
& Williamson Counties. The Com- Court of Milam County  
ordered said line to be Surveyed more than one year  
ago. The Com- Court of Williamson was duly notified.  
I was appointed to represent Milam County in making  
the survey of said line. I applied to the Com- Court  
of Milam County to furnish me with a copy of the  
field Notes of Milam County, or of said line ordered  
to be surveyed. Said Court could not do it. nor was  
there any such field Notes on record in the County.  
I then applied to yourself, or Mr. Fisher, and you  
notified me that there was no such field Notes in that  
Office, and referred me to the field Notes as set forth  
in the revised Statute of 1879. I then proceeded with  
the work according to the order of the court; Adhering  
strictly to the field Notes in the revised Statute of

1879. and the law therein directing how said work  
should be accomplished. The surveyor of Williamson County  
did not meet me. and I proceeded with the work, as  
described in the field notes, allowing  $10^{\circ}$  variation as was  
originally allowed. Before making my report however,  
and to attest the accuracy of my work, I traced the line  
between Bell & Falls Counties with the same variation  
for a distance of eight miles, and ran right over  
or within in a very few feet of each post. Now certainly  
if the line that has been established between Bell & Falls  
Counties is correct, the line I run between Wilson & Williamson  
must be correct. about one year after I made the above  
survey, Wilson County ordered a resurvey of the county line  
in order to connect said line, with the lines of the original  
surveys through which it passed. at which time the surveyor  
of Williamson County was present. He began at the proper place  
and after running one mile from the beginning corner.  
some parties came and told us that what they had been  
told was the old line was elsewhere. and the other surveyor  
went with them to see the old line. & come back & insisted  
on that being the old line & that we should change & run that  
line. I told him that we could not do it & work according to the  
order & field notes under which we were instructed to work

and told him that Milan County would not receive such a report - but he insisted that he should run the line & as the men were employed by him, for he insisted before the work began, that he should employ men in that section of country to assist me, and so he made an offset one Mile ~~apart~~ from the beginning corner of 41 varas from my line. They run from there 7 Miles & 90 varas & cornered 360 varas south of my corner. and on the 2<sup>nd</sup> line he ran over 240 varas further north than I did. Making a difference of over 600 varas on the 2<sup>nd</sup> line. I measured the line 20 Miles & had two honorable old - young men to carry the chain (10 vara chain) who swore they did their duty to the best of their ability. After working 4 Miles on the 2<sup>nd</sup> line I told the other Surveyor, that I would not work longer, for I did not believe that we were doing the work right, and proposed that we refer the matter to you at once. And he said that he was going on as he had been & did go on. I then got me up a set of hands & made the connections on my line as stated in the field notes. and the distances stated therein were found by actually measurement on the ground.

Mr. Hulsh. I write this that I & Milam County may know that you have this thing properly stated to you. All that Milam County wants is justice. The Surveyor of Williamson County should have been present at first. I am willing & even anxious if you are not satisfied, that you appoint some good Competent-practical & disinterested Surveyor to make the survey over.
