

Special Term April 12th 1890

Be it Remembered that upon this 12 day of April AD 1890 there was begun and Holden within and for the County of Milam a Special term of the Commissioners Court of said County for the purpose of appointing a Constable for Precinct No. 1. There were present C. G. General Co. Judge presiding, A. S. Ruby Com. Precinct No. 1, J. M. Little Com. Precinct No 3 and W. C. White Com. Precinct No 2, A. J. Lewis Sheriff and W. M. Giel Co. Clerk.

Proclamation having been made the following proceedings were had to wit:

This day came on to be heard the report of W. M. James Surveyor for Milam County and A. S. Haworth Surveyor for Williamson County establishing the County line between said Counties as follows to wit:

State of Texas { To the Hon. Com. Court
County of Milam } of Milam Texas,

Report of the boundary line between Milam County and Williamson County Texas as made by W. M. James Surveyor for Milam County and A. S. Haworth surveyor Williamson County under and order of the respective Commissioners Courts of said Counties issued at the Feb. Term of each 1890. We the said surveyors met at a point near the SE corner of the T. & G. survey commonly known as the Post Oak Island Survey on March 25 1890 and after ^{an} consideration of the essential points involved in locating said boundary line we agreed

to determine the true course & bearing of the south
line of said P.A. Graves survey and to adopt the
magnetic variation of said line as the variation to
govern us in locating the boundary line between
said Counties. This we did by carefully retracing
a portion of the old marked line of said survey and
found the variation to be $8^{\circ} 50'$ East and which
is the same as that determined by W.M. James by an
observation of the Polar star a few days since.
We found the S.E. corner of said Graves survey
on the West side of a small branch and well defined by
the original bearing trees still standing and plainly
marked. At this point we began our measurement as
ran and measured thence N 5/8 E eight miles following
an old marked line all the way and terminated in
a farm where at the terminus of the eight miles
thus measured we planted a large Pin Oak post
not being able to obtain the kind of timber required
by law for the S.E. corner of the Williamson County
and the S.W. corner of Milam County from which a
Post Oak outside of farm 18 inches dia bears N 68 $\frac{1}{4}$
W 109 $\frac{3}{4}$ on. marked W. This corner is or has heretofore
been the beginning point of the disputed territory be-
tween said two counties and extending N 19 W
20 miles. From this corner made and agreed upon
by us we ran and measured a line thence N 19 W
taking distances in feet instead of varas as follows
At 441 feet crossed a branch at 453 feet past 13
feet to the right of a Post Oak 22 in. dia marked W.C.
at 552 feet a fore & aft. line tree at 4480 feet crossed
the Yegua, runs S 55 E at 4581 feet crossed a branch
near its confluence with said creek at 4859 feet

crossed said Yegua at 5255 fut intersect the
SE line of the Henry Cook survey at 5280 fut
set a large mulberry post in Yegua bottom for the
1st mile from which a Pin Oak 34 inches dia marked
N bears N 32 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 40 feet and a Pin Oak, 3 inches dia
marked W bears N 52 $\frac{1}{2}$ W 36 feet, Continued at one
mile 710 fut (from the beginning corner) recrossed
said Yegua at one mile 1110 fut crossed Taylor
and Road at one mile 3000 fut a ravine at 1
mile 5280 ft set a mulberry post for the 2nd mile
post from which a Post Oak 30 inches marked C $\frac{1}{4}$ N
bears N 66 W 7 fut, Continued at 2 miles 5280
fut set a stake and raised an earth mound for the
3rd mile post from which a Post Oak 30 in dia
marked 3 N bears S. 14 $\frac{1}{2}$ W 11 fut, Continued
at 3 miles 2170 feet crossed a ravine at 3 miles
3375 fut crossed an old blazed line bearing N
70 W at 3 M. 5280 fut set a cedar post for
the 4th mile post from which a Post Oak
18 in marked 4 N bears S 4 W 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ fut another
Post Oak 16 in. marked 4 N bears N. 65 E 16 fut
Continued at 4 miles 1475 fut crossed a ra-
vine at 4 miles 2428 fut crossed another ravine
at 4 M 2555 fut crossed another ravine at 4 M 3466
ft, intersect P.C. Caseys South line in a road
at a point 1674 yrs from the East line of the Har-
rison Owen League and 104 yrs from said
Owens North line at 4 M 3484 fut and Caseys yard
fence the County line just cutting the N.C. corner
of said Caseys Barn and placing his residence
in Milam and his barn in Williamson at 4 M
5280 ft, set a cedar post for the fifth mile post

from which a Post Oak 14 in dia marked 5M
bns N 31 $\frac{3}{4}$ E 10 feet another Post Oak 24 in marked
5M bears N 63 W 27 ft. Continued a 6 M 5280
ft we made the 6 mile point in a form
from which a Post Oak outside of farm
18 in marked M bns N 52 $\frac{1}{2}$ W 42 ft. another
Post Oak 18 in. dia. N 16 W 52 ft. Continuing
at 6 miles 52 80 ft set a cedar post for the
7" mile post from which a Post Oak bns
N. 35 $\frac{1}{2}$ W 116 ft. Continuing at 7 miles 764
ft intersect the south line of the George
Foley survey 262 ft from its S.C. corner as
now fixed on ground at 7 M 5280 ft set
a cedar post in the prairie for the 8" mile post
from which a Post Oak 26 in. dia marked 8M
bns. N 19 W 72 ft. Continued at 8 M 3895
ft. crossed a large branch in Brushy Creek
bottom at 8 M 5280 ft set a stake in bot-
tom for 9" mile from which two Elms
from the same root bears S 85 W 35 ft.
the left hand one marked 9, the right
hand one marked M. Continued at 9 M
276 ft. intersect the south line of the Justo
Liendo 4 league grant as now located
on ground at 9 miles 2600 ft the south
bank of Brushy Creek it runs N 10 E at
place of crossing and is 200 ft. wide
from bank to bank an angle of line at
9 M. 5280 ft set a mesgt. post for 10" M (in
prairie no bearings) Continued at 10 M
5280 ft. set a mesgt. post for 11" M from
which an Elm marked 17 M bns. N 98' 8 ft.

1 Continued at 11 M. 850 ft. the middle of the
2 I & G. N. R.R. tract on an embankment 60 ft
3 to the right or east of the East end of a R.R.
4 bridge over a branch and 40 23 ft. from
5 the S.E. corner of the R.R. platform of the station
6 house at Thordale and 3137 ft. from the switch
7 lock at West end of switch and 2906 ft. from a
8 large painted board marked N/W set up by
9 the R.R. Co. to designate the County line at 11 M
10 5280 ft. set a Cedar post for the 12" mile post
11 from which a mesgt. 4 in marked 12 M b.s. S⁸⁶E
12 W 35 ft. another mesgt. 4 in marked 12 b.s. N
13 16 W 36 ft. Continued at 12 M 300 ft. crossed
14 a prairie hollow at 12 M. 2391 ft. intersect the
15 division line of the Justo Lieds 77 ft. S⁷⁰E
16 from said division corner on the West line of
17 said grant dividing it into two equal parts
18 by line running S⁷⁰E at 12 M 2970 ft. crossed
19 Turkey Creek at 12 M 3610 ft. South bank
20 of a lake about 200 ft. wide at 12 M 6280
21 ft. set a Mesgt. post for the 13" mile from which
22 an Elm 6 in marked 13 M b.s. S³²E W and
23 a mesgt. 5 in marked 13 M b.s. S. 2¹/₂ W 6¹/₂
24 ft. Continued at 13 M 6280 ft set a cedar
25 post for the 14" mile from which a mes-
26 quite 4 in. marked 14 M b.s. N 6¹/₂ W 4 ft
27 and a mesgt. 5 in marked W b.s. N 4¹/₂ W 48
28 ft. Continued at 14 M. 5280 ft. set a
29 mesgt. post for the 15" mile from which
30 a mesgt. 14 in marked 15 M b.s. S 15 E 33
31 ft. and a mesgt. 4 in marked W b.s. S 13¹/₂
32 E 35 ft. Continued at 15 M 4560 ft. crossed

1 Picau branch at 15 M 6280 ft. made the 16th
2 mile post in a farm. Continued at 16 M 5280
3 ft. set a cedar post for the 17th mile in small
4 timber in the San Gabriel bottom. Contin-
5 ued at 17 M. 848 ft. the south bank of the
6 San Gabriel River at 17 M. 1200 ft. North
7 bank of said river at 17 M 2382 ft. intersect
8 the S.E. line of the Pedro. Garza 6 league grant
9 280 mrs. S. 2 W from its N.E. corner at 17 M
10 5280 ft. set a cedar post for the 18th mile from
11 which a mesquite tree marked N. 65 E. 19 W
12 100 ft. Continued at 18 M 5280 ft. set a cedar
13 post for the 19th mile. Continued at 19 M. 5754
14 ft (or 20 miles 474 ft.) we intersected the
15 County line projected S. 65 E from the S.E.
16 cor. of Bell County which line is well
17 defined on the ground and about which
18 there is no controversy. At this point we
19 planted a cedar post marked N E COR W C O.
20 in a farm. We ran a portion of said
21 line N 65 W and found the magnetic varia-
22 tion to be the same or nearly the same as
23 that we had adopted.

24 In closing this report we wish to say
25 that we have faithfully and impartially
26 discharged the duty imposed upon us
27 and have fixed the boundary line be-
28 tween said counties which we trust
29 will prove satisfactory to all con-
30 cerned and eliminate the troubles heretofore
31 existing with reference to said line.
