Dear Sir: Yours of the

7th (with reference to the field notes of Mills County) to hand. You state that the line running N. 82° E. is excessive 1575 yrs. - If you will carefully examine the field notes of Mills County as laid down in the Act creating the County, you will see that there is no distance called for on the line running N. 82° E. - The distance called for, is 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles N. 60° E. from the W. line of Comanche County, which would be at right angle with said W. line. The line running N. 82° E. is 10 miles 625 yrs. from the point where it crosses the W. line of Comanche County to that point which is 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles N. 60° E. from the W. line of Comanche County. —

I worked in connection with the Surveyors of Brown, Comanche & Hamilton Counties. (each successively) in running the lines between Mills & those Counties & they were, each, satisfied that the work was correct.

— The surveyor of Lampasas County refused to work with me & I ran the line between Mills & Lampasas
